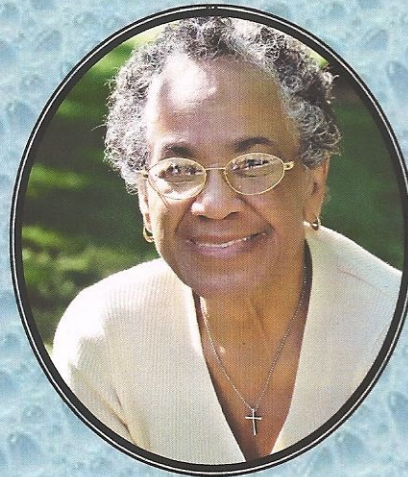

Obituary

Mary Ann Moore was born to Henry Moore and Emma Wilkes Moore on February 11, 1934. She was the tenth of ten children born to this union. She accepted Christ at an early age.

Mary Ann was educated in Haskell and Bartlesville schools and graduated from Nowata, OK Public Schools. She furthered her education at Langston University in Langston, OK.

She was united in marriage to Ellsworth "Spider" Webb and to this union two daughters were born. She later united in marriage to Earnest Hall and to this union a set of twins were born.

She united with Corpus Christi Catholic Church in 1964 and served faithfully until her death.
