Precious Memories (Obituary)

The blessed life of Vivian Clenita Jones-Crowley began October 14, 1948; she was born to Rufus and Fannie Jones. She claimed her spot as number three among six siblings.

Vivian started her education at Attucks Elementary School and advanced on to attend Dumbar High School in Okmulgee, Oklahoma. In 1963, the family relocated to Oklahoma City, OK, where she attended and graduated from Central High School with the class of 1966. Following her high school graduation she attended Langston University in Langston, OK, where she received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Business Administration.

Vivian's employment career began with the Oklahoma City Public Schools, as an Administrative Officer. She also worked at Western Electric.

Her relationship with Christ began at an early age at Cleaves Memorial CME in Okmulgee, OK. In 1983 she joined Greater New Bethlehem Temple, where she was baptized in Jesus name and served as a faithful member. She was a minister of the gospel; sang in the Choir; was a Planning Board Member for the Women's Ministry; Secretary for the Ministerial Staff; Director over the GNB/T Meals on Wheels Program and the Nursing Home Ministry. Vivian served several years on the state level as the Global Missions Secretary for the Southwestern District Council (SWDC); for her service she received an award for SWCD Missionary of the Year. Vivian was a mighty prayer warrior/intercessor and was willing to do whatever her hands found to do in the house of the Lord.

Vivian was preceded in death by her father Rufus; Mother Fannie; one sister: Zelma; a grandson Ahrizjauh; and husband Hugh Crowley. She leaves to cherish her memory: one son Sidney L.
