## Obituary

Marlon Wayne Colston was born October 12, 1953 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma to Wilbert and Doris Colston. He was the first born of their four sons.

Marlon attended Northeast High School, but ultimately graduated from Northwest Classen High School in 1971. Upon graduating, he enlisted with the United States Marine Corps., in which he served his country during the Vietnam War. After being honorably discharged in 1973, Marlon remained federally employed by gaining employment with the United States Postal Service. It was there he met his wife, Deborah. During his postal career, Marlon was a proud member of the American Postal Workers Union (APWU), serving as a Union Steward. He also was chief pioneer in the renaming of Cimarron Station Post Office to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Station Post Office. In 1996, Marlon retired from the United States Postal Service after 26 years of service.

Church before converting to Catholicism, where he then became an active member of the Corpus Christi Catholic Church. There he was a member of the Knights of St. Peter Claver. always dancing, smiling, joking, and laughing. His kids used to constantly tell him, "Daddy, you play too much!"
