Obituary

Hubie Lee Anderson was born July 22, 1943 in Statesboro, Georgia. He was the youngest child born to Rozella (Nedd) Anderson and Hubie Anderson.

Hubie received his high school diploma from William James High School in 1961.

Hubie received the Lord at an early age. After graduating high school, Hubie entered the United States Air Force where he served his country well. During Hubie's years of service, he traveled all over the country, fought in the Vietnam War and received several awards.
