Carolyn Marie Peters was born the oldest of seven children on February 17, 1952 in Kingfisher, Oklahoma to Claudette Peters and Wayne Stevenson.

She attended Central State University, studying in the area of Counseling Psychology and later graduated from the University of Oklahoma in 1983 where she received a Master's Degree in Human Relations.

In 1990, Carolyn became an entrepreneur investing in rental properties. She not only owned the properties but also managed them. It was not uncommon for find her actually doing some of the repairs. She developed good relationships with her tenants and was always inquiring about their relationship with God.

She was a life-time member of the Langston University Alumni Association and a member of the NAACP. In 2010, Carolyn received her Certificate of Progress for the First Phase of the Christian Education Diploma presented by the Christian Education Accreditations and Credentials Sunday School Publishing's Board, National Baptist Convention, USA, INC. She also taught in the East Zion Consolidated District Congress of Christian Education and the Leadership school at Fairview.

After graduation, she served seven years as a volunteer for the Department of Human Services in the Family Services Unit; a service she truly enjoyed as she served as a mentor for troubled youth. She was nominated for Volunteer of the Year and was also nominated for the Channel 5 "Who Cares Award." Carolyn's consuming and passionate desire to be of service to mankind directed her life and it was evident in all her endeavors. She was a woman of noble character, unwavering integrity, with a compassionate spirit and was always found helping her family, friends and anyone she came in contact with. Her strength, support and talent for making others feel special was a blessing to all who knew her.

She had a special concern and passion for leading the lost to Christ. From her youth you could always find her in the marketplace sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with others. She
