

## Obituary

Cordelia Ann (Webb) Bennett, was born November 25, 1948 in Holdenville, Oklahoma to the late Rev. Thomas L. and Eugenia Webb. Growing up as a preachers' kid impacted her life immensely. Observing the roles of her father and mother influenced her leadership in the church and her musical career.

Cordelia began her musical studies at the age of three with her mother. Later, she studied at Corpus Christi Catholic Church

under the tutelage of Sister Barbara Ann. She competed, in piano, at numerous competitions receiving the highest ratings. Cordelia was also the accompanist for El Reno High School's Concert Choir until she graduated.

Cordelia attended several universities to include: Langston University, the University of Central Oklahoma, and Oklahoma City University (OCU). While at OCU she studied with the world-renowned Clarence Burg and Inez Silberg. Cordelia was the accompanist for the Silberg Repertoire courses for two years during her studies at OCU. She was also honored to receive the esteemed Burg Music Scholarship. Cordelia has shared her gifts and talents both throughout the United States and while living in Germany. She became fluent in German, and on occasion she would share her mastery of the language with close family and friends.

Cordelia composed and arranged many songs for various organizations. She was the first African American musician to produce, arrange, and compose an educational album for Melody House, Inc., a national educational recording company. The album entitled, My World is Round, was distributed nationally and placed in most daycare facilities and libraries. One of her greatest accomplishments was the formation of The Three Dimensions of Joy. She has played alongside some of the world's greatest musical artists, but none brought her more pleasure then the work she has done in the church. She served as Musician, Director, and Minister of Music for many denominations. Within the African Methodist Episcopal Church she served with diligence on every level of the church, working not only with the youth but the women's missionary society. She was also honored to serve on the Connectional Music Committee, currently known as Music and Christian Arts Ministry (MCAM) where she was able to use creativity to encourage young people to operate freely in their gifts.

After more than 38 years of unparalleled service and dedication to young people, Cordelia retired from the Oklahoma City Public School System. Her passion for mentoring young musicians is evident by the number of former students and performing artists that continually paid homage as a result of her musical excellence.

Cordelia was preceded in death by her mother, father, and her husband the late Rev. Dr. Hugh D. Bennett. She leaves to cherish her memory one brother, Rev. Thomas Webb (Sondra); one sister Clara Stewart Fish; one daughter, Harriet Bennett Cooper (James); and four sons, Mark, Paul, Tony, and Phillip (Lesile); two beloved great-grandchildren of the home, Bethani and Kamilah; and a host of other family and friends.
