Obituary

Roosevelt Heath Hicks was born to Ennis Hicks and Minerva Heath on March 7, 1937 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He was raised by his maternal grandparents, Reverend Jody Heath and Beatrice Heath. He attended public school in Oklahoma City, graduating from Douglass High School in 1956.

Roosevelt married Mary Houston in 1956, and they began raising a family together. He remained a faithful employee of Allen Shoe Store until joining the United States Army. He served proudly in the Korean and Vietnam Wars as well as traveling to a host of places, such as Germany and Thailand. He retired and continued to work as he loved to do. He lived a full life and enjoyed passing the stories on to anyone who would listen.
