## Willie George Washington

On Tuesday, September 12, 2019, Willie George Washington, loving husband and father of two children passed away at the age of 82.

Willie George Washington, Deacon of Nehemiah Baptist Church in Midwest City, Oklahoma was born on February 22,1937 in Olustee, Oklahoma. Willie G. Washington moved to Altus, Oklahoma early in his life. He attended Macedonia Baptist Church. He graduated from Lincoln High School where he thrived in his leadership roles as Editor of the Yearbook; Treasurer of Band; President of Chorus; Vice President of State Youth Organization; President of Student Council, and Manager of Girls and Boys Basketball Teams.

Willie G. Washington was enlisted in the United States Army Signal Corps in 1960 and retired in 1983 as a Chief Warrant Officer (CWO-3) after serving 23 years. His duty assignments were: Landstuhl and Giessen, Germany; Okinawa, Japan; Vietnam (2 tours); Turkey (2 tours); Korea (2 tours); Hawaii; Fort Huachuca, Arizona; Fort Gordon, Georgia; Fort Bliss, Texas; Fort Sill, Oklahoma; Fort Bragg, North Carolina; Fort Polk, Louisiana; Holloman Air Force Base, New Mexico. Willie G. Washington was the recipient of the Bronze Star Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with Four Service Stars, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, Good Conduct Medal Second Award, Army Commendation Medal with Second Oak Leaf Cluster, Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Palm, Three Overseas Service Bars, Army Service Ribbon, and Overseas Service Ribbon Fifth Award.

He earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts in Radio and Television Broadcasting from the University of Oklahoma. Additionally, in 1979 he obtained a Master of Science Degree in Adult Education from the University of Southern California while stationed in Baumholder, Germany.

After retiring from the United States Army, Willie G. Washington went to work and retired from Oklahoma City Community College (OCCC) as a school administrator for 17 years. After this retirement, Willie G. Washington and his wife moved to Kirbyville, Texas. During this time, he worked as a substitute teacher at Kirbyville High School. After 4.5 years, Willie G. Washington returned to Oklahoma City, where he also worked as a substitute teacher at Westmoore High School.

While stationed at Holloman AFB, Willie G. Washington met and married the love of his life, Ethel Virginia Polly. This union was blessed with two sons. Willie G. Washington was a devoted and proud father. Having been an educator himself, he was especially proud of his son's academic accomplishments. George W. Washington earned a Master of Arts in Curriculum & Instruction while Charles E. Washington obtained a Ph.D. in Information Technology. Also, he was an affectionate grandfather to Eric M. Washington and Charles E. Washington, Jr.
