Before a child is first conceived A cry goes up, "Lord, let it be." And from His throne room way up there, God's ear is tuned to a Mother's prayer.


Then daily as this little child grows, "Keep evil away" the angels are told! And by the swords and shields they bear, God has heard that Mother's prayer.

That compels Him to answer this Mother's prayer.


Now all grown up and on his own, She prays for him by letter or phone. And God stands by with His right arm bare, To listen and answer a Mother's prayer.

# Obituary

Larry Dean Montgomery was born on September 6, 1953 to Wilma J. Montgomery and Sylvester Montgomery in Oklahoma City. He was the second of eight children.

He was preceded in death by his maternal grandparents, Hollis and Kattie Pickett; paternal grandparents, Frances Gaines Taylor and Bessie Montgomery; and cousin/best friend, James Bunyan Greenhoward III.

Larry had a kind, humble and friendly spirit and was loved by those who knew him. He had a huge heart and offered his support and resources to family and friends. He worked extremely hard and would sometimes work multiple jobs to help others in need. He had a calm demeanor and seldom raised his voice. He never spoke badly of people and would always try to see the good in others. Although Larry was not religious, he was a Believer. He lived his life in a manner that exemplified the scripture found in Ephesians 4:32. He clothed himself with compassion and kindness, and consistently forgave others.

Larry loved sports, especially OU football, the Oklahoma City Thunder, and golf. He could be found on the golf course anytime the weather permitted. Larry was an active member of the Eastern Golf Club (EGC) of Oklahoma City. The Club was formed by a group of black men and women to introduce and encourage minority youth to get involved with the sport and positively impact the community. In 2003, the EGC Junior Golf Program was established as a 501(c) (3), which allowed the Club to not only provide free golf lessons, but subsidize tournament entry fees and travel expenses for program participants. It also allowed the Club to provide grants to minority golfers pursuing PGA certification. Since 2003, the EGC has granted more than \$30,000 in renewable scholarships to deserving youth in the area.

Larry is a 1971 graduate of Bishop McGuinness High School and also completed college hours at the University of Oklahoma and Central State University (now the University of Central Oklahoma). At the time of his death, he was employed as a Moulder Operator at Caston Architectural Millwork, where he was a loyal and dedicated employee for 27 years. He also established a tax preparer business (Montgomery's Tax Service) and would frequently go unpaid for his tax preparation work. He never complained or pressured his clients for payment. He believed in helping those in need.

Larry departed this life on October 1, 2019. He leaves to cherish his memory his mother, Wilma J. Montgomery; his father, Sylvester Montgomery (Maria); daughters: LaCresha Johnson-Senter (Edward) and LaKeesha Montgomery; granddaughters: Lakara Montgomery, Patience Montgomery, Layla Senter, and Christian Montgomery; grandson, Edward Senter, Jr.; great-granddaughter, Koriah Montgomery; brothers: Bruce Montgomery (Rhonda), Dale Montgomery (Vilynsia), Craig Montgomery (Heather), Donald Montgomery (Andrea); sisters: Felicia Montgomery, Deborah Jenkins (Ezekiel), and Dianna Berry (Major); and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
