Mr. David McClam entered into eternal rest on Tuesday, October 15, 2019 at the Oklahoma Heart Hospital in Oklahoma City, OK. He was born on October 23, 1951 in Lake City, S.C. to the late Mr. Clyde McClam Sr. and Mrs. Henrietta Atkinson McClam.

David McClam attended the public schools of Lake City and graduated from Carver High School in 1969.

At an early age, David received Christ as his personal Savior and attended Wesley Chapel United Methodist Church during his time in Lake City. David was baptized in the name of Jesus and received the gift of the Holy Ghost while attending Greater First Deliverance Temple. More recently, he became a faithful member of Quail Springs United Methodist Church until he departed this life.

David joined the United States Air Force in 1969 and was stationed at Tinker Air Force Base in Oklahoma City. He met his late wife, Vernessa E. Conway McClam, in April of 1972.
