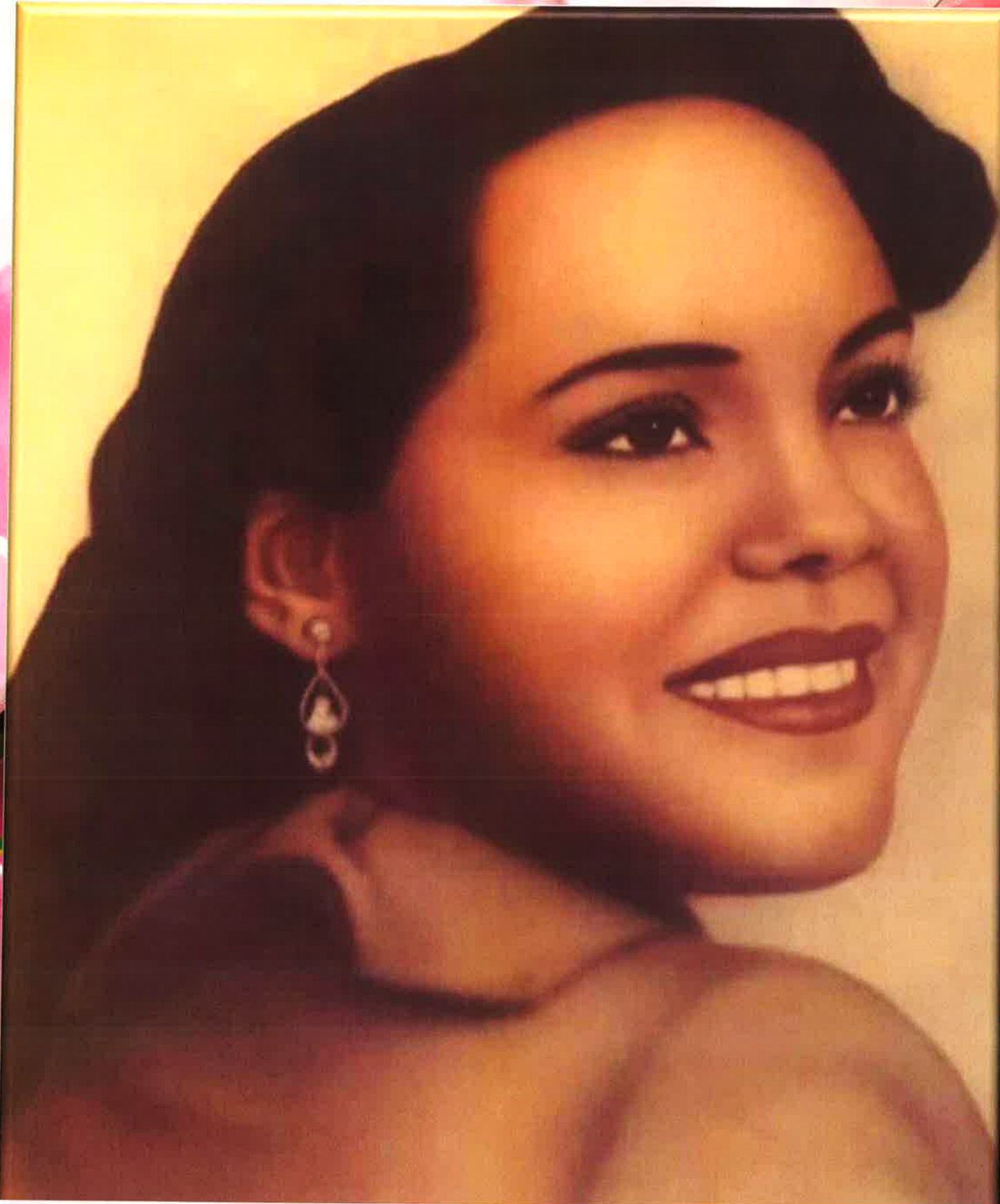

## **HER STORY**

Frankie Beatrice Kincade was born on Tuesday, February 25, 1930 in Hempstead County, of Redland Township, Arkansas. She was the sixth child born to Joseph Walter and Mary Emma Kincade. Her loving daughter, Janice Faye Stafford, preceded her in death, in addition to her parents: Joseph and Mary Kincade; three brothers: Charles Kincade, Robert Kincade, and Joseph Kincade Jr.; five sisters: Evelyn Wilson, Annie Johnson, Susie Fowler, Josephine Evans, and Carnelia Ward; and two great grandsons: Charles Hill and Ranord Robinson.

Frankie was baptized along with her siblings at Zion Chapel Baptist Church, one of the oldest churches in Eudora, Arkansas, located across the street from the family's home where their mother, Mary, was the Church Mother.

Frankie's early education began in Eudora and she later moved to Marin City, California to assist her sister, Susie, with her nieces and nephew. Frankie continued her education at Tamalpais High School in Marin City.

In the spring of her life she met and married Joe Willie Jordan, and they were blessed with five amazing children - Joyce Marie, Jo Ann, Janice Faye, Darrel Edsel, and Rodney Craig. In 1948 the family moved to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and they became an alluring duo. With their love for people, business savvy, and vision, Frankie and Joe became owners of several prominent businesses. They served the community with respect and dignity. Frankie's contagious enthusiasm along with Joe's desire to serve enabled their businesses to thrive.

In the early 1960s Frankie began her nursing career at Saint Anthony's Hospital. In 1965 she was certified as a Labor and Delivery Nurse Technician at Baptist Hospital in Oklahoma City.

In 1970 Frankie met and married Leslie Paul Lambeth. The marriage presented Frankie the opportunity to share her love and nurture Leslie Paul's four young daughters: Cheryl Vena, Ardrea Lavern, Valerie Mishelle, and Leslie Donetta. Blending their families, they moved to Choctaw, Oklahoma where they joined the Nicoma Park Church of Christ. Frankie embraced country and rural life that included livestock and the rodeos. Frankie loved being a Mom, managing the home, and attending to cattle. She transported the children to and from school and extracurricular activities, doctor visits, cooked and hosted family dinners, drove the hay trucks, and herded the cattle.

In 1978 Frankie was diagnosed with Breast Cancer. With treatment and following the doctors' directives, she was declared cancer free. Realizing the importance of early detection, she became an active advocate for Breast Cancer Awareness, and she encouraged her daughters, granddaughters, and women throughout the community to have annual check-ups.

Frankie enjoyed reading and attending healthcare workshops and seminars. She continued to exemplify her outstanding work ethic. In the autumn season of her life she accepted a position as a mail clerk for the State of Oklahoma and was promoted to Mail Room Supervisor. She worked in that position for over ten years until she retired.

Frankie returned to her nursing roots and became a caregiver, extending free services to the elderly. She loved gardening and had a remarkable green thumb. Her flower garden was a major display in the Carverdale neighborhood where she proudly showcased a variety of colors and seasonal combinations for neighbors and visitors to experience.

Frankie was a lady of enormous inner strength and resilience. She faced many challenges throughout her life but never complained. She approached each day with tenacity, vigor, and gratitude. It was more than 30 years that she worshiped with the Northeast Church of Christ which she joined and was a faithful member, studying the Bible with the women's Bible study class, giving praise, and being of service.

Some of Frankie's happiest moments were spending time with her family for Sunday dinners, celebrating her birthday, and honoring Mother's Day! She cherished these special days that the family always acknowledged because they knew how important they were to her. Frankie loved sports and she could watch football and basketball alone or with family and friends. Whether alone or with others, when her team scored a touchdown or made a basket, her excitement reverberated as though ten people were in the room.

Coffee was Frankie's favorite drink. She could drink it all day every day. Something her grandchildren remember about her was her always asking them, "How are you percolating?" Her California grandchildren vividly remember how much they loved to have their grandmother visit them because she would take their breakfast orders and make exactly what each of them wanted to eat. Her Oklahoma grandchildren remember her "healing bed" because when they felt ill, she would have them lay in her bed where she would nurse them back to health. Her Nevada grandchildren had the opportunity to have their grandmother live in Nevada, spend time with them daily, and attend their school activities, events, and special occasions.

In the winter season of Frankie's life, she enjoyed going back to her homeplace in Eudora, Arkansas to visit with her siblings - Evelyn, Louise, Josephine, Carnelia, and Jay. It was the recent loss of her sister, Carnelia, that Frankie was deeply saddened, realizing she was the last of her siblings living in God's grace.

Frankie always held her family close to her heart. She often shared stories about her parents and siblings, children and grandchildren, which left a strong imprint on everyone's mind of her love and passion for family. Frankie recalled times spent with her parents and siblings. She proudly shared stories with her children and grandchildren to remind them that "As a Kincade, you come from good stock!" and "We are strong people, and don't you forget it!" She would always end the conversation with, "Kincade's love their babies!"

The name Frankie means "Free One" and Beatrice means "The Bringer of Joy". Indeed, she was free spirited and a source of joy. Frankie loved her family and approached life with energy and zest. She appreciated the abundance in her life, and she reevaluated her goals often. She was independent, a planner, and a businesswoman. She never compared herself to others. She was open-minded and a progressive thinker. She practiced kindness and loved sending cards of encouragement to any and everyone. Frankie was blessed to spend the last seventeen years in the home of her daughter and son-in-law, Joyce and Waymon, being the last surviving of the Kincade siblings. Frankie was blessed to be part of five generations during her life, to include her offspring starting with eldest child Joyce and her children: Felicia, Joylicia, and Emoni.

Frankie's family holds many cherished memories of her long life of four score and nine years and her genuine love for all her family. Celebrating her story and happy memories are her children Joyce (Waymon) Swanegan of Forest Park, Oklahoma; Jo Ann (Willie) Alford of San Carlos, California; Darrel (Marsha) Jordan of Edmond, Oklahoma; Rodney (Emily) Jordan of Las Vegas, Nevada; Cheryl Franklin of Midwest City, Oklahoma; Ardrea Lambeth-Smith of Yukon, Oklahoma; Valerie (Augustus) Fields of Choctaw, Oklahoma; and Leslie Lambeth of Jones, Oklahoma. Two loving sister-in-laws Ira Kincade of Fontana, California and Aserey Kincade of Eudora, Arkansas. A loving goddaughter, Vera Randle of Forest Park, Oklahoma. Two long-time family friends, Mary Frances Davis and Lemuel Harris both of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, 28 grandchildren, 45 great grandchildren, 5 great-great grandchildren, and many beloved nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
