Obituary

First Lady Esther Deloris Braxton was born as Esta Delorse Terry to Willie Mae and Roosevelt Terry on April 28, 1950 in Harris, Oklahoma. She was the only child to this union. Sometime after Esther was born, the family moved to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Esther's grandmother Gertha Jones-Hall (Williams) whom she called Mama was very instrumental in her life. She helped raise her into the wonderful woman she was.

Esther met the love of her life Darryl W. Braxton, Sr. at her best friend Betty Craig's wedding. Betty married Darryl's brother Barry Braxton, Sr. Esther and Darryl fell in love and married on June 17, 1972. To this union were 6 children; 4 boys and 2 girls.

Esther graduated from Douglass High School in 1968. Upon graduation, she continued her studies at Langston University in 1968. Transferring to OU attending 1968-1970. She also attended Oklahoma Southern Christian University in 1980, where she received an Associates in Business. Esther continued her education from 1998-1999 at the University of Phoenix, receiving her Bachelor's in Instruction Information Tech. In 2005, she received a Master's Degree from Oklahoma University in Administration. Esther was big on education and pushed her children and grandchildren to follow suit.

Esther was employed with the State of Oklahoma serving 40 years. Starting with the University of Oklahoma in the records department from 1969-1970, the Oklahoma Tax Commission from 1978-1979, State Department of Education from 1981-2011, and her remaining years as an Computer Programmer for the State of Oklahoma 2011-2016. She also worked in the Office of the Management and Enterprise Services.

Esther's favorite quote was, "Always live according to God's Word." January 1965, Esther received the gift of the Holy Ghost and was baptized by Elder Arnett Bryant, Sr. She served the Lord faithfully, from Sunday School Teacher to First Lady. Everyone she met knew her heart for Christ. She was a Prayer Warrior. Her children and grandchildren would continually talk about how she served and carried herself. She was a perfect example of how to love, care, support and forgive.

Esther was preceded in death by her grandmother, Gertha Jones-Hall (Williams); her father, Roosevelt Terry; her mother, Willie Mae Carter; her 2 sons, Gregory W. Braxton and Darryl W. Braxton, Jr. (Edell); and a host of aunts and uncles.

Esther leaves to cherish her memories, her husband Darryl W. Braxton, Sr. of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; four children: Lola Braxton-Webb (Reginald) of Blue Springs, Missouri; Thomas (Ebony) Braxton; Timothy (Petrina) Braxton, Sr. and Nicola Braxton, all of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; 20 grandchildren, 4 great grandchildren, and a great grandchild on the way.
