Obituary

Leroy Moore was born in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, May 22, 1940, and raised by Janet Lawrence and Lonnie Lawrence. He was the second oldest of four children: Phillip (oldest brother), Percy (youngest brother), and Juanita Sue (youngest child and only sister).

Leroy attended Harrison Elementary and Douglass High School. At the young age of eighteen, he enlisted into the United States Navy, while enlisted, he attended Laney and Alameda College in California where he obtained his Bachelor of Science in Physical Education.
