Doretta House Nelson passed away peacefully on January 28, 2020 in Plano, Texas at the age of 67.

Born on August 11, 1952, in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, to Jonas and Mary House, Doretta was the third of seven siblings. Doretta was a 1970 graduate of Douglass High School where, true to her outgoing nature, she participated in many high school activities including basketball, Debate Club, Y-teen, Honor Society, Pep Club, Teen Democrats, Future Teachers of America, and Girls Scouts. A faithful woman from a very early age, in her time in Sherman she was a member of Harmony Baptist Church where she worshipped and sang in the church choir.



A fter graduating college, Doretta and her family moved to Boulder, Colorado, where she had her second child Michael Nelson Jr. There, she began her career at Great West Life Insurance Company. In 1982, the family relocated to Plano, Texas where Doretta remained for the duration of her life. After 30 years of service, she retired from Great West Life Insurance Company in 2008.

Doretta was known for her zest for life, fashion and enthusiasm for learning. She was a voracious reader and conversationalist; a go to person for anyone who wanted to know the specifics regarding the latest local, regional or international current event.
