Eva Mae Gentry was born on February 17, 1927 to Jeff and Laura Tubbs in Payson, Oklahoma. She was the third of 13 children born to this union.

Eva graduated from Chandler High School. She accepted Christ at an early age. She was reared in the Greater Shiloh Baptist Church and remained a member until the Lord called her home to be with Him on March 19, 2020.
