The Legacy of a Man of Valor

Deacon Bruce Lee Roberts Sr. was born on September 7, 1953 to Columbus B. Roberts and Helen Fave Brown (Roberts) in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma at St. Anthony's Hospital. He was a door keeper, brother, husband, father, godfather, cousin, friend, and associate.

Educational and Career Journey

Deacon Bruce Roberts attended Edwards Elementary, Kennedy Jr. High, and graduated from Douglass High School, Class of 1971. He attended Oklahoma Christian University then decided to go a different route in education, attending Frances Tuttle Vocational School and becoming the first African American to graduate from the Independent Electrical Contractors, a 4-year program as well as becoming a Certified Electrical Coding Teacher at Francis Tuttle. He worked for Harrison Electric, Cobb Electric, OU Medical Center, Frontier City, General Motors where he retired after 29 years of service. He also owned his own business called Roberts Electric.

A Legacy of Love

Deacon Bruce was a God fearing man, who loved God with all his heart, and acknowledged him in all his ways, he received Christ at an early age and attended Evangelist Temple, Church of God in Christ in 1953 under the pastoral leadership of Elder J.R. Sapp, he and his family later joined, Sixth and Jordan, COGIC under the Pastorage of Bishop W.E. Jefferies. After Bishop Jefferies' passing, he furthered his spiritual journey with Victory Temple, Church of God in Christ World Ministries Center Incorporated under Bishop Malcolm W. Coby. Over the years he has served in many capacities: Local, District, State, and National Usher Board for the Church of God In Christ. He started ushering at the age of eleven. On January 3rd, 2004

he became the State Usher Board President of the Southeast Jurisdictional Church of God In Christ. His favorite scripture was, "For a day in thy courts is better than a thousand. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God, than to dwell in the tents of wickedness" (Psalm 84:10 KJV. He also served as a Local Y.P.W.W. President, a Deacon on the Deacons Board, Church Facilities Coordinator for Victory Temple, COGIC, Vacation Bible School, Trustee Board and lastly started the Media Team at Victory Temple, COGIC World Ministries Center Incorporated, which was one of his favorite areas to work.

From Labor to Reward

Deacon Bruce was such a loving, kind-hearted, hardworking, and giving person, he had a heart to do for many. He was a man of few words but when he spoke, it was full of wisdom and jokes. He was a great example of a servant leader to all that he could and was allowed to serve. Whether in Corporate America or being selfemployed. He was a family man who believed in taking care of his family and leaving a legacy that it is better to give than to receive. He Loved being a part of a CB (Citizens Band Radio) Club called Night Riders and his nickname was Sugar Bear. He loved going on dates with his wife, taking pictures, fishing, spending time with his children and grandchildren, his church family, and having family time.

Deacon Bruce was preceded in death by his parents, Helen and Columbus Roberts, his sisters Brenda L. Roberts and Donna A. Roberts, and one brother Glenn R. Roberts. He leaves, his loving wife of over 40 years, Gwenda L. Roberts, his children; Ann-Etta H. (Norman) Booze, Bruce L. (Brittany) Roberts II; two grandsons: Bruce L. Roberts III (Trip), Elijah A.
