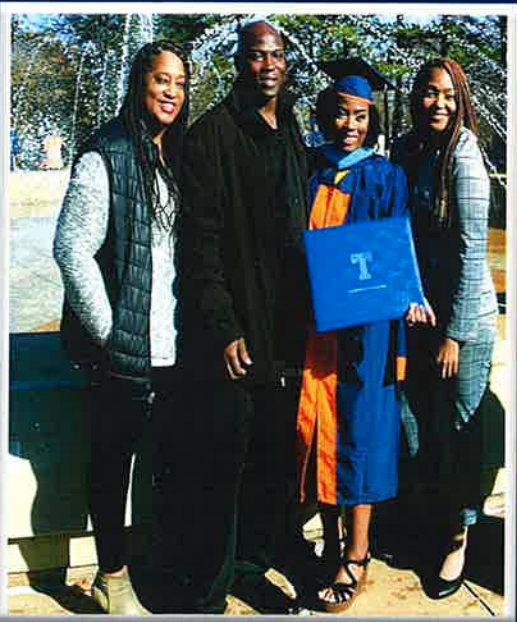
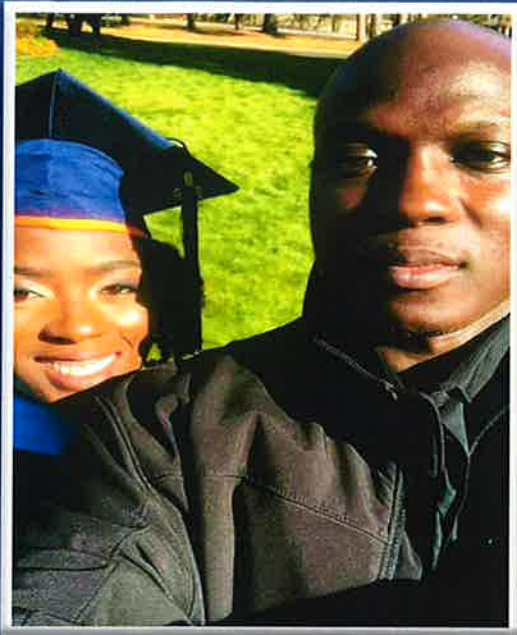

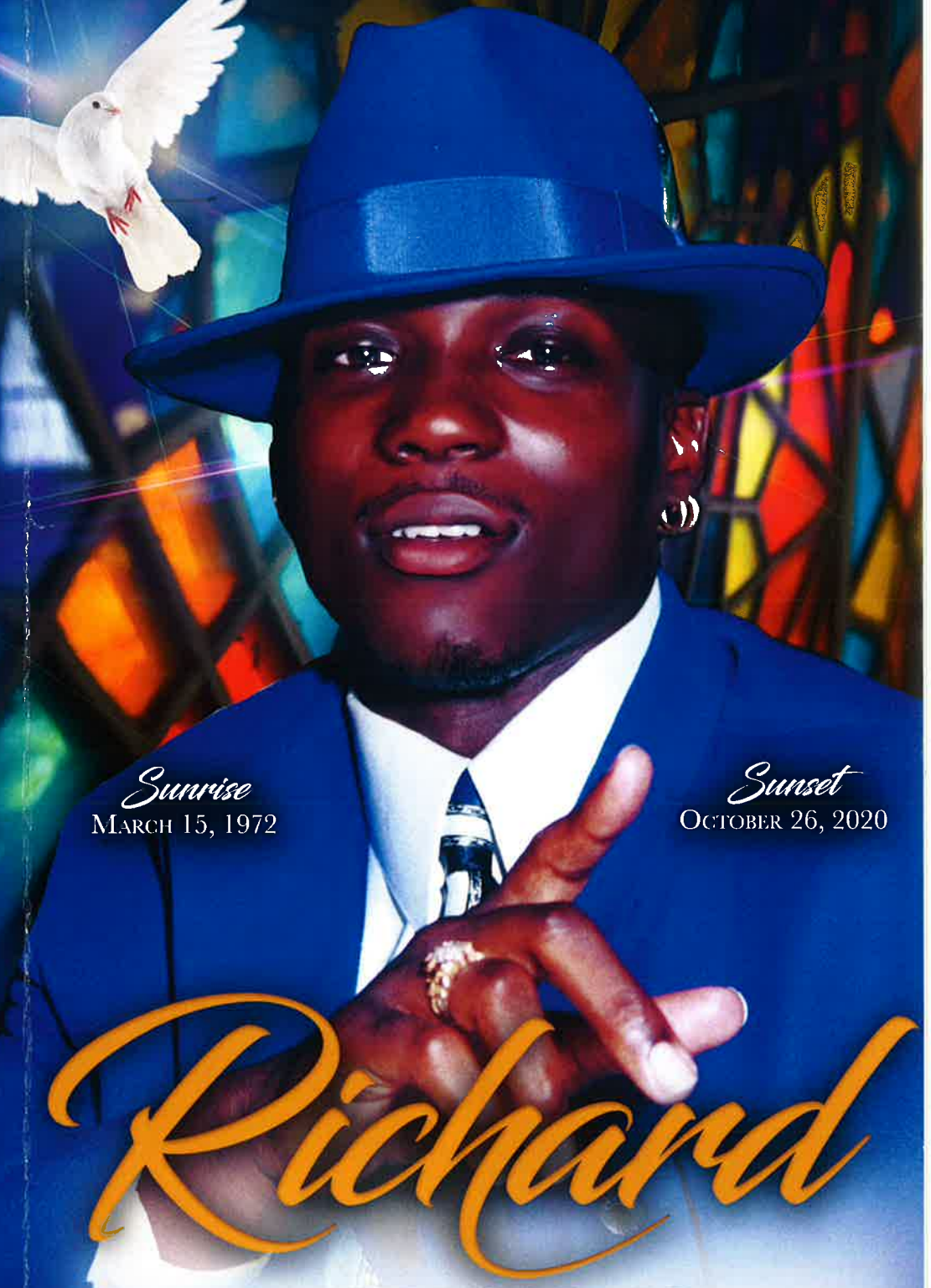

From *RJ*

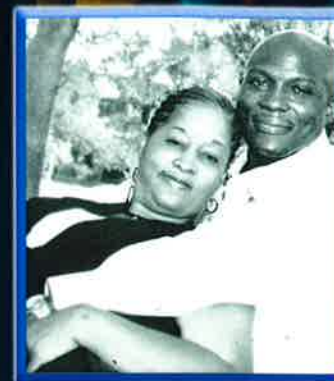
