

CELEBRATION OF LIFE

Dr. Kary Gerone Free was born May 4, 1950 in Memphis, TN to Willie Free and Eva Ponder Free.

Dr. Free accepted Christ at an early age as well as his call into the ministry. He preached his initial sermon at the age of 18. He continued to learn and grow in the Lord. Growing up in a military family, he was blessed to attend school in Spain and many other places throughout the United States. This allowed him to establish a plethora of lifelong friendships. After graduating from Rancho High School, he attended the University of Nevada at Las Vegas where he earned his undergraduate degree. He later earned his Master's degree from Virginia Union in Richmond, VA. He also received honorary doctorate degrees from both the Determined Biblical Theological Institute of Baltimore and from the Fellowship Bible Institute.

Earlier in life he met and married Yvonne Robinson and to this union two children were born; Kari Yvonne and Erika Alexis. Later in life, he united in marriage with the lovely Velva Fuller. They were married for over 19 years.

Dr. Free dedicated his life to preaching, mentoring, and pastoring. He first pastored in Susan, VA at the Antioch Baptist Church. Later he pastored the Gethsemane Missionary Baptist Church in Norristown, PA before accepting the call to Greater Mount Carmel in 1988. He believed strongly in prayer. He introduced his congregation to the book Could You Not Tarry One Hour by Dr. Larry Lea and instituted early morning prayer along with 24-hour prayer prior to revivals.

He was an active member and leader in the Progressive Oklahoma Baptist State Convention (POBSC) and the Progressive National Baptist Convention, Inc. (PNBC) on both the regional and national levels. Dr. Free served as Vice-President at Large of the Southwest Region of PNBC, Inc. He served as Chair of the PNBC Evangelism Board, PNBC Congress of Christian Education instructor, PNBC Executive and many other leadership positions.

His affiliations included the Baptist Minister's Association in Oklahoma City, One Church One Child of Oklahoma where he served as President. He served as Regional Vice President of the National One Church One Child. He was also a member of the NAACP, the Oklahoma City Concert of Prayer and the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

Dr. Free was preceded in death by his daughter, Kari Yvonne; stepfather, Harold McGough; father, Rev. Willie Free and mother, Eva McGough.

He transitioned from earth to eternity on October 31, 2020 at Integris Baptist Hospital in Oklahoma City, OK.
