# Reflections of the Life of Sandra Kaye Holloway

An astute student, a stickler for detail, a warrior, a dedicated mother, a community activist, a friend, and one committed to the mission of her church; "To assist one another in spreading the good news of Jesus, beginning in the community, and throughout the earth". Yes, Sandra Kaye Holloway embraced this vision and remained faithful.

Sandra Kaye Holloway was born to Shedrick and Beatrice Mimms on February 1, 1943 in Tulsa Oklahoma. She was the youngest of four siblings. She lived her early life in Tulsa where she graduated from Booker T. Washington High. She was actively involved in student government and other civic organizations.

Sandra graduated from Langston University in 1965 with a B.A. Degree in Biology and in 1983 she graduated from Oklahoma State University, with a M.S. Degree in Occupational and Adult Education.

In 1967, Sandra married Maurice Holloway, to this union was born 2 children, Chris and Chametra Holloway. In the later days of her life, she and Chametra were like two peas in a pod; where Sandra was, so was Chametra. Chametra became a champion for the welfare of her mother, serving her with all diligence.

Sandra united with Fairview Baptist Church shortly after her marriage. She actively served at Fairview under the leadership of Reverend J. A. Reed, Jr. for over fifty years. Sandra was known for her range of service. She served as co-chairman of the Woman's Ministry Home and Foreign Mission Committee, member of the Mission Chorus, member of the Christian Education Committee, Elusta Holloway Mission Action and Study Group, instructor for the Adult Women #2 Sunday School Class and a member of the Evangelism Follow-up Committee. She also served as chair of the OBSCWA Fashion Share Committee.

Sandra received her first Certificate of Progress in April 1999 for Phase One of the Certificate of Progress Program and in February 2002, she received the Instructor's Certificate to teach in Leadership Schools and Congress of Christian Education throughout the Oklahoma Baptist State Convention. Both certificates were presented by the Department of Christian Education Sunday School Publishing Board, National Baptist Convention U.S.A., Inc.

She served as Registrar for the Oklahoma Baptist State Woman's Auxiliary to the Oklahoma Baptist State Convention. She was appointed to serve on the State Camp Burge Commission and became the Camp Burge Youth and Adolescent Foundation Secretary.

Her community and social affiliations included Tutor/ Mentor for the HOST Program (Help Our Students To Succeed) sponsored by the Oklahoma City Public School System, City Wide Home and Foreign Mission Organization, Wildwood Hill/ Heights Neighborhood Association and Beta Sigma Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. She retired after 27 years as an Inventory Management Specialist a Tinker Air Force Base

Sandra Holloway was preceded in death by her parents, Shedrick and Beatrice Mimms; Parents-in-law, Samuel and Myrtle Holloway; Son, Chris Holloway; Brother and wife, Pascal and Gussie Mimms; two sisters, Dorothy Mimms and Emma Henderson.

She is survived by one daughter, Chametra K.
