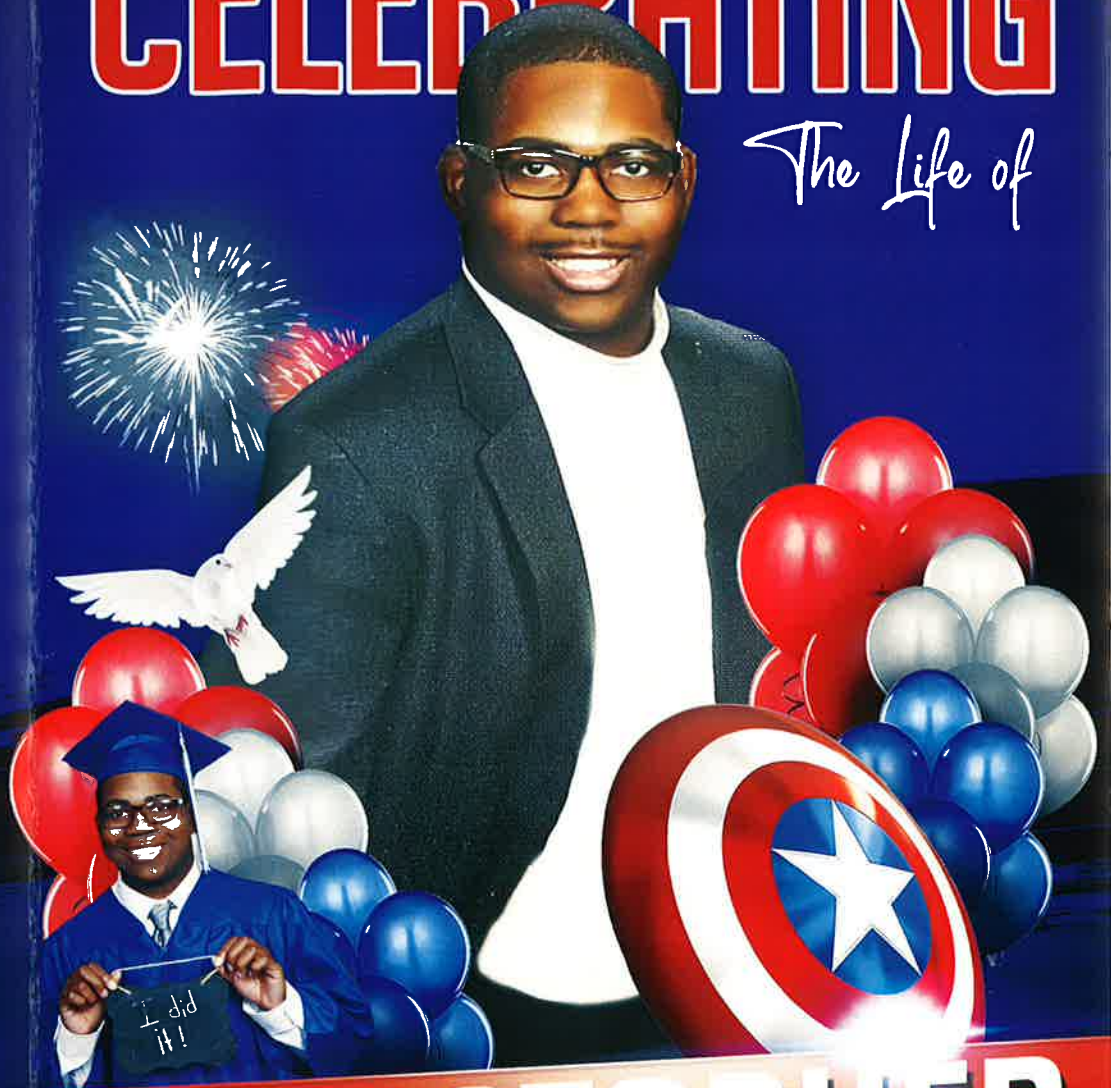

Christopher Bryce Lee was born on June 21, 1999 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He was the third son of Dr. Rudell III and Kirsten Lee.

Christopher began his education at True Vine Christian School where he attended through the second grade. He then transferred to Sequoyah Elementary where he graduated from the fifth grade. In sixth grade he was accepted into Classen School of Advanced Studies where he was a Visual and Performing Arts Vocal major. Christopher graduated from Classen SAS in 2017 and attended OCCC for a few semesters. He then began to attend Metro Technology Centers where he was studying Graphic Design.

Christopher was a faithful member of Greater First Deliverance Temple. He was baptized in Jesus name and filled with the Holy Ghost at an early age. He was a member of the Children of Destiny Choir and served on the usher board.

Christopher always had the gift to sing. He was a member of the Sequoyah Elementary Honors Choir, Norman Children's Choir, Canterbury Choir, and the Young Choirs of Central Oklahoma. While in the fourth grade, Chris was blessed to sing a duet in Italian with a college student at the UCO Jazz Lab. During his middle school and high school years, he was a member of the 6th Grade Choir, Fam Vocal Choir, COCDA Honors Choir, OCDA Honors Choir, Jazz Choir, All Boys Choir, Madrigal Choir, High School Mixed Choir, Men's Choir and Classen SAS Honors Choir. In addition to his vocal skills, Christopher was also talented in the visual and literary art forms. He spent hours drawing and would frequently write poetry.

Christopher was very quiet, detail oriented and sensitive. He was dedicated to his family, church, school and job. He worked for Life Recovery Services for two years. He was always concerned about doing the right thing and doing things just right. He tried to please those around him and was always very helpful.
