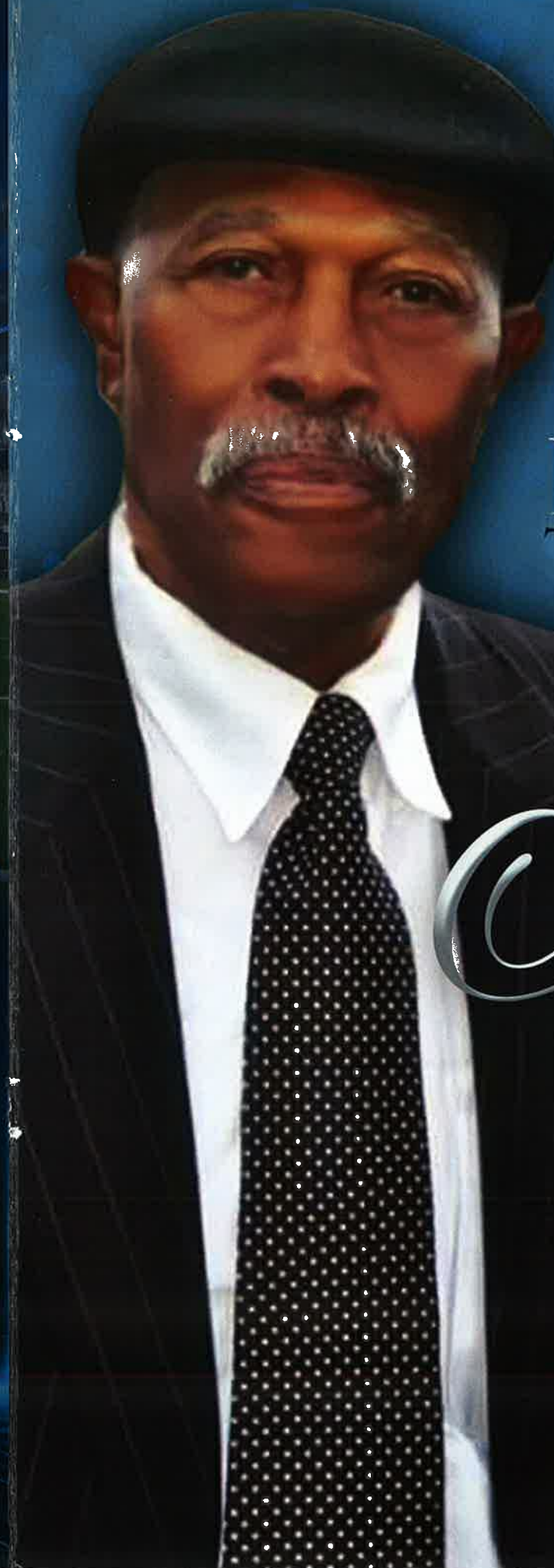

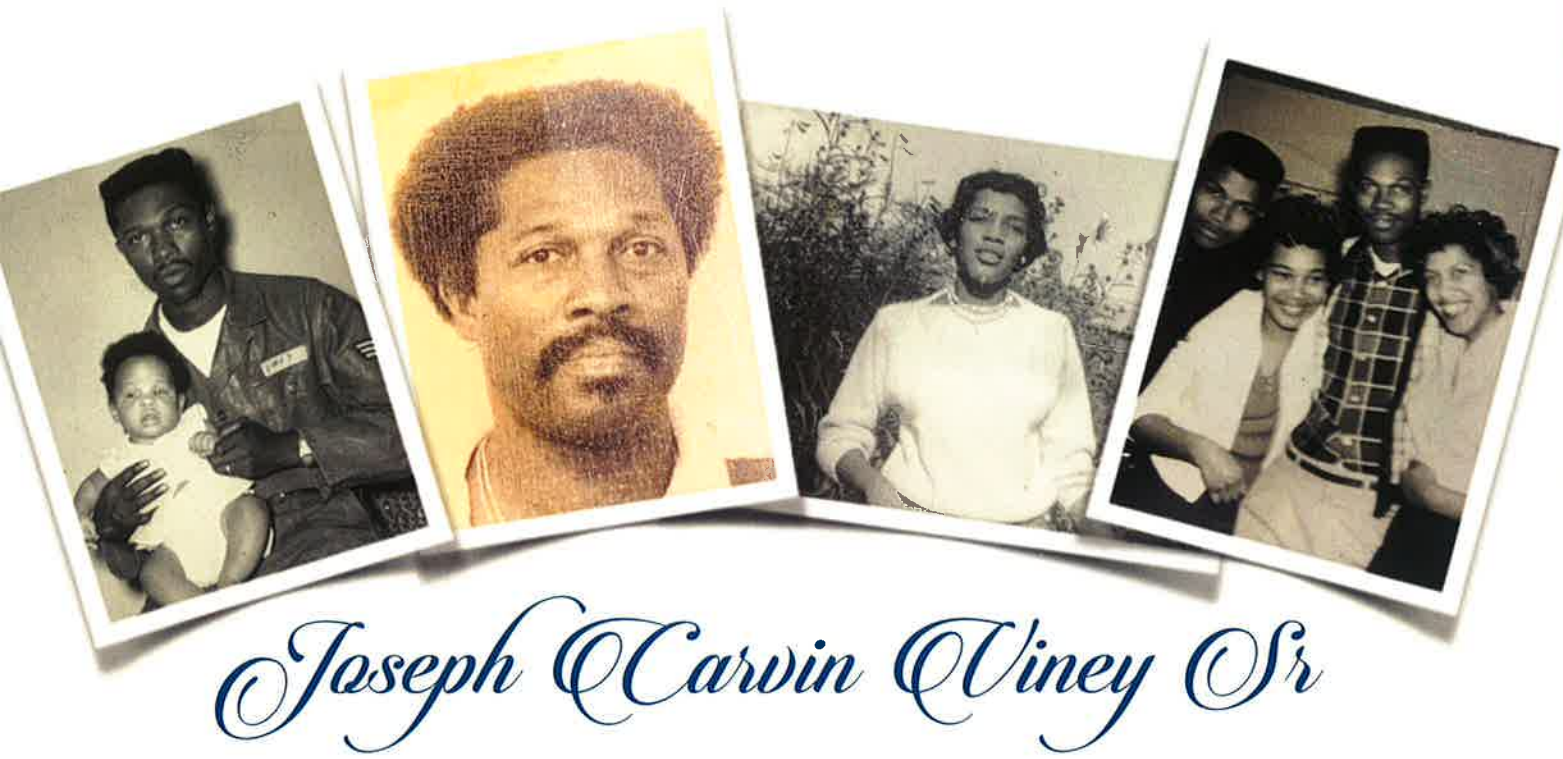

Joseph Carvin Viney Sr. was born in the small town of Stringtown Oklahoma to The Reverend Fred and Arbellar (Martin) Viney on June 16, 1938. Joseph was the second to the last born of eleven children. He attended Stringtown Elementary and Dunbar High School where he played basketball and studied agriculture. At an early age, he accepted Christ under the leadership of his Pastor and father Reverend Fred Viney at St. Mathews in Stringtown, Oklahoma.

Joseph united in marriage to Yvonne Oralee Yarbrough on January 26, 1959, after years of courtship while attending high school together. Joseph decided to go join the Air Force once he found out the Army wanted him and was stationed out of Fayetteville North Carolina at Fort Bragg. Later he was shipped to Greenland in North America.
