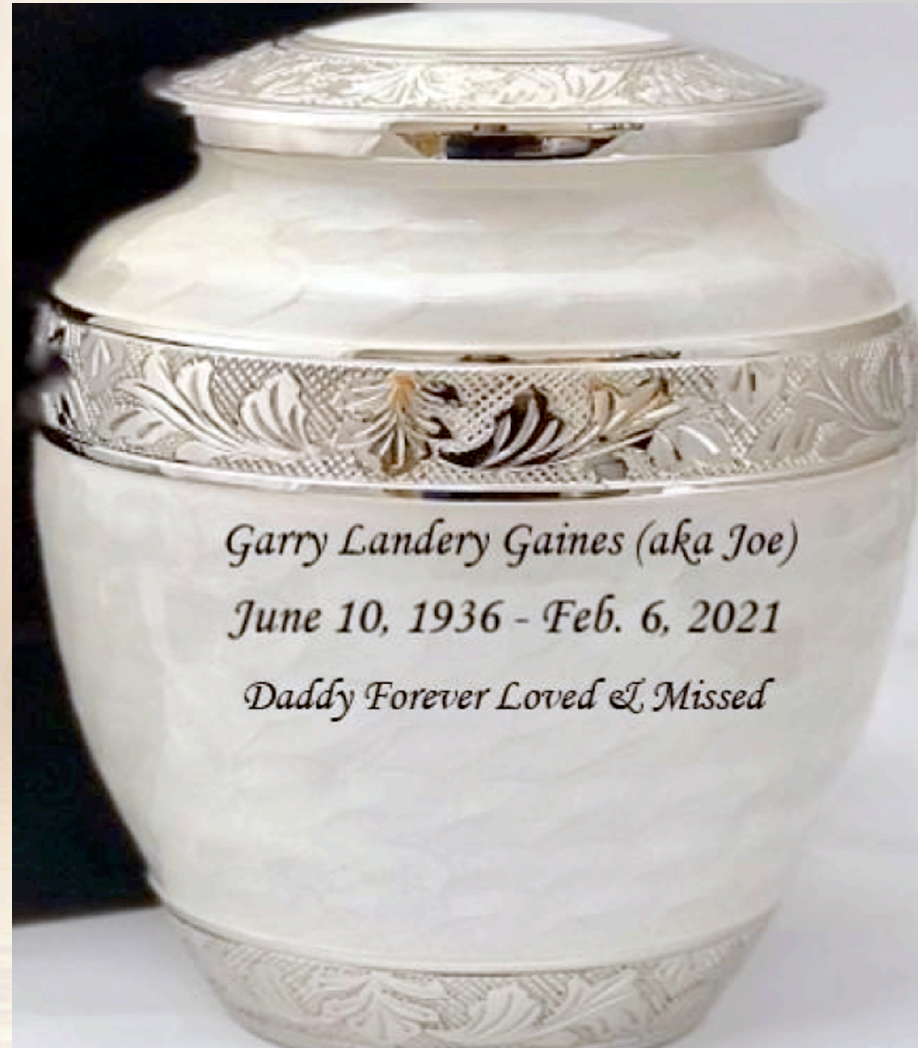

Garry Landery Gaines (aka Joe) was born on June 10, 1936 to Bennie Gaines who was a Boot Blacker and Bessie Newton who was a House Keeper in Seminole, Oklahoma. He was born by a Midwife in a car.

He was preceded in death by his parents, brother Fred Patterson, brother George Earl Morgan, and sister JoAnn Morgan.

At a young age, Garry and Bessie moved to Oklahoma City. Garry was sent to a Boys Home in Boley, Oklahoma believed to be “State Training School for Incurable Negro Boys” after he started misbehaving and running away from home. That is where he received his education. Garry and Bessie reunited many years later after being released from the Boys Home and was introduced to his younger siblings for the first time.

As a young man in Oklahoma, Garry worked odd jobs at Ice Houses and Grocery Stores. Garry was trained to be a carpenter by Bessie’s new husband Dan C. Nickelson and worked with Dan in Texas. Garry moved from Oklahoma City in 1962 to Kansas City, KS where he lived for 55 years before family relocated him to McKinney, TX for the remaining three years of his life. His life in Kansas City was a very long lived life as a carpenter, small businessman and husband. Garry married twice and is currently married to Eula M. Halliburton for the last thirty-five years. They separated in 1998 in an amicable manner, but their love and friendship has been long lasting. In their years of marriage, Garry helped Eula in raising children and grandchildren. Together they formed a life full of love.

Garry’s favorite pastime was fishing, fishing and more fishing all from banks, lakes, creeks and rivers. Garry’s second pastime favorite has to be eating. He loved to eat good cooking and knew his way around the kitchen as well.
