

Obituary

LEE THELL WOMACK, JR. was born March 11, 1947 to Lee Thell Womack and Bernice Days in North Little Rock, Arkansas. He was raised primarily by his mother and grandmother, Pairlee Jernigan Days Arnold.

As a small boy Lee Thell attended New Dora Baptist Church which held services in the Pulaski County Training Auditorium. Lee Thell's family walked to Church because they didn't have a car. In the late 50's the family started attending Fairview CME Church after arthritis prevented Lee Thell's grandmother from walking more than a mile to New Dora Baptist Church. In 1995 Lee joined Emmanuel Baptist Church

in Oklahoma City where he served as Treasurer and supported the Emmanuel Youth Ministry.

Lee Thell graduated as Valedictorian of Viola A.W. Harris High School in 1965. He joined Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. while attending Philander Smith College (a private, historically black college) where he graduated in 1969 with a Bachelor of Mathematics degree. Lee





graduated from Naval Postgraduate School in 1980 with a Master's degree in Operations Research. Lee's Master's thesis project was completed using punch cards which are no longer in use with today's technology.

While recruiting in Oklahoma, Lee met Frances Glover and began a courtship. Lee and Frances were united in holy wedlock on

March 7, 1974 in Newport, Rhode Island. They enjoyed 42 years of marriage. To this union, three lovely children were born; Angela, Crisandra, and Lee T., III. From a previous marriage, Lee was blessed with a wonderful daughter, Michelle.

Lee enlisted in the Naval Reserves in March 1964 to help pay for college. He was Commissioned in October 1969. Lee served at the following duty stations during his 25 years 10 months 8 days in the military: USS Edward McDonnell DE-1043 (1969-1971), US Navy

Recruiting District Oklahoma City (1971-1973), USS Marvin Shields FF-1060 (1974-76), USS Duluth LPD-6 (1976-1978), USS Constellation CV-64 (1980-1982), Office of the Chief of Naval Operations (1982-1983), Surface Warfare Officers School (1983), USS Brooke FFG-1 (1984-1985), Commanding Officer Naval ROTC Unit Prairie View A&M University (1985-1987), Commanding Officer USS Schofield FFG-3

(1987-1988), Commanding Officer USS Copeland FFG-25 (1988-1990), Navy Recruiting Command in Arlington, VA (1990-1995). Lee was a member of the National Naval Officers Association, and served as President 1993-1995. Lee retired from active duty in August 1995 and finally brought his family back home to Oklahoma. Lee then served as the Senior Naval Science Instructor at Del City High School from which he retired in 2016.



In the church, Lee was a dedicated worker in his duties as Treasurer and math tutor. Lee loved children and teenagers. He enjoyed his second career at Del City High School where he was able to spend "father son hang time" with his son, little Lee. Captain (as Lee's NJROTC kids called him) touched the lives of over 2,000 Oklahoma youth and their families as an educator in the Mid-Del School District.

Lee enjoyed listening to gospel music, watching sports, riding his John Deere lawn mower, playing with his tech gadgets, sending selfies of his fashionable ties on Sunday morning, and hugs. Lee had a life long love of mathematics and could still do calculus until the end.

Brother Womack was preceded in death by his wife, Frances U. Womack; his parents; an aunt/sister, Bishop Augustus Stout; and a sister,



Margaret Robinson. He leaves to mourn his passing one son, Lee T. (Kelsey) Womack, III (Nashville, TN); three daughters, Michelle R. Womack (Frisco, TX), Angela M.
