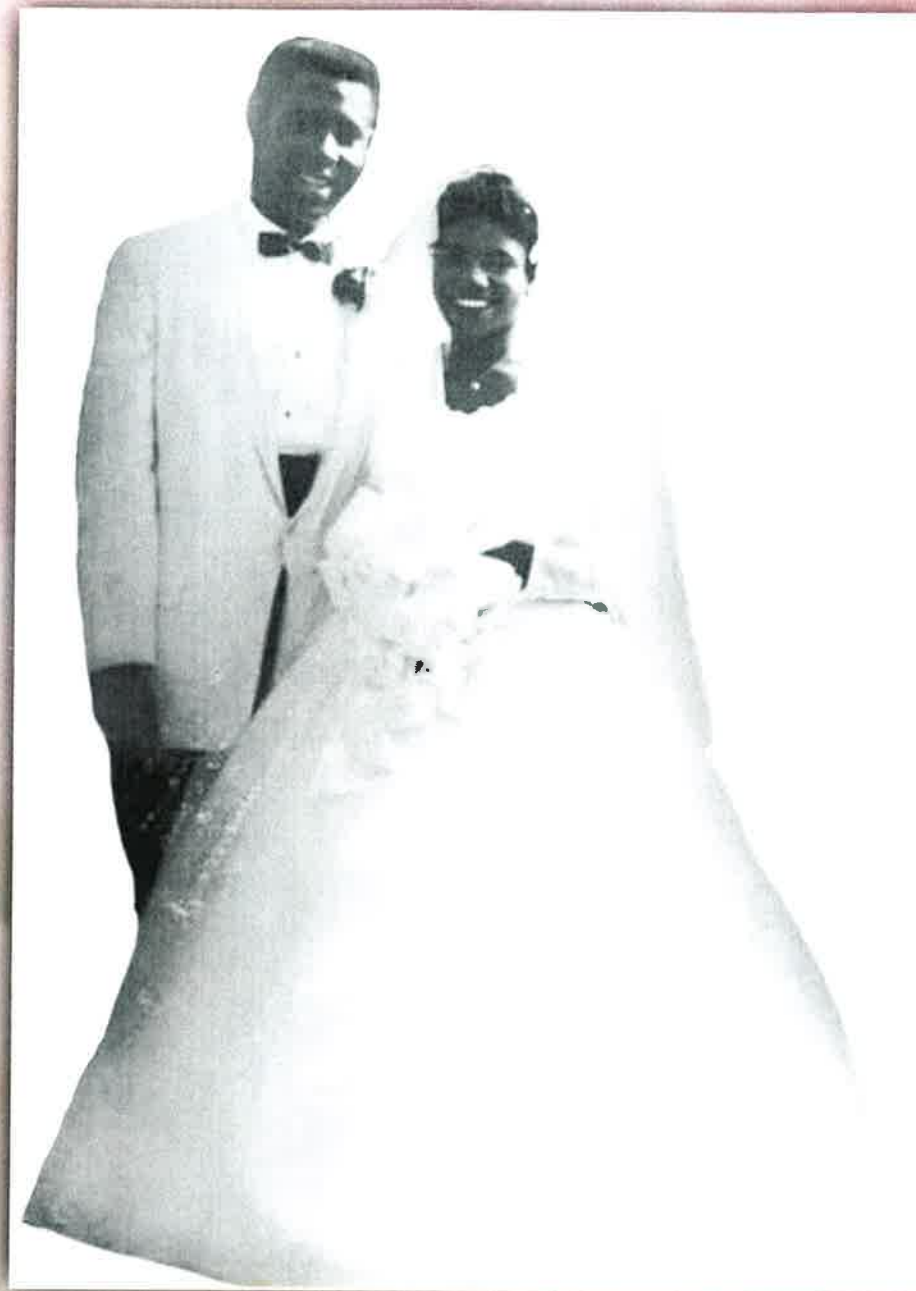

Esther attended Sweethome Elementary and Wellston Dunbar High School. After the Supreme Court ruled in the landmark Brown v. Board of Education decision for integration, she then attended Wellston High School where she graduated in 1960.

Esther’s grandparents raised her in the nurture and admonition of the Lord by instilling sound Christian principles at the Sweethome Baptist Church. In the summer of 1959, she met the love of her life Lloyd J. Davis and they were married September 4th, 1960 and to this union was blessed with four sons; Karl, Bruce, Gary, Steven, and two daughters; Toni and Teri.

Under the evangelistic teachings of the late Dr. Clyde Muse, Sr. she obeyed the gospel and was baptized into Christ in 1967 at the Eastside Church of Christ located at N. E. 36th and Prospect in Oklahoma City, OK.

In 1986, she became a trailing spouse after her husband was transferred twice between the Tinker Air Force Base in Oklahoma City and the Air Logistics Center in Sacramento, CA. They happily resided in California until it became apparent that the Sacramento Air Logistics Center would be closed due to Base realignment measures. In 1991, Lloyd was transferred to the Air Logistics Center located in Warner Robins, GA. However, this woman of virtue took it all in stride and utilized her skillset to continue working in doctors' offices until becoming disabled in 1996. Lloyd and Esther retired in their hometown of Oklahoma City in 2000 where she enjoyed a comfortable life spent with family and loved ones until her health began to fail.

The Master in His infinite wisdom called Esther home on March 13, 2021. Preceding her death were her grandparents George and Lurleen West; her father Lucia Glover, mother Martha West-Youngblood; Sister Sherrill Youngblood and twin Brothers Michael & Mitchell Youngblood.
