Obituary

Margaree Harris began a lifelong journey on March 18, 1928 born to the late Aaron and Ressie Simms in Wellston, Oklahoma as the youngest of two children. On Friday, March 27, 2021 an angel stopped by her bedside and took her home to be with the Lord. She is preceded in death by her parents Aaron and Ressie Simms; one sister Deborah Garrison.

As a child Margaree's parents grounded her in values that shaped her life's journey. Growing up her parents instilled strong Christian values, indelible moral values, and an intense work ethic. She loved being close to her mother's side and there she gained a calm, quiet spirit and the compassion for loving people. As a young woman she accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior and was baptized after her public confession in the Church of God and became a Missionary for the Lord. She was educated in Wellston and attended Wellston-high school. Shortly after high school she moved to Oklahoma City with her sister. She began work as a domestic worker and provided services for Britton and Whitten families with more than fifty years of loyal service, retired.

On March 8, 1968 Margaree and Curtis Harris were united in Holy Matrimony. Curtis brought three children to this union: Donna and William Harris, both of Maryland; one son Richard preceded her in death. They continued this union until her death. Margaree was always active in church and in later years she served the Church of God Through Christ as the Pastor's wife and mother of the Church. Margaree loved children. Though she had no biological children she cared for her nieces and nephews as her own. She was a mother at heart nurturing her church family as well.

Margaree hobbies were reading, playing the piano, singing, reciting and writing poems and traveling the fifty states to visit family and friends, spending time with her Cocker Spaniels, sweetie.

Margaree had a tremendous passion for gaining knowledge and went on to complete her General Education Diploma (GED). Well into her late years she took classes at an Oklahoma City Public School to learn Spanish.

We take great comfort in the precious memories of the ninety-three years she shared with us. She leaves to cherish her memories her loving husband of fifty-three years, Bishop Curtis Harris, of the home. Three Step-Children, Donna Harris of Upper Marlboro, Maryland; Two step-sons William Harris of Axon Hill, Maryland; Richard Harris preceded her in death.
