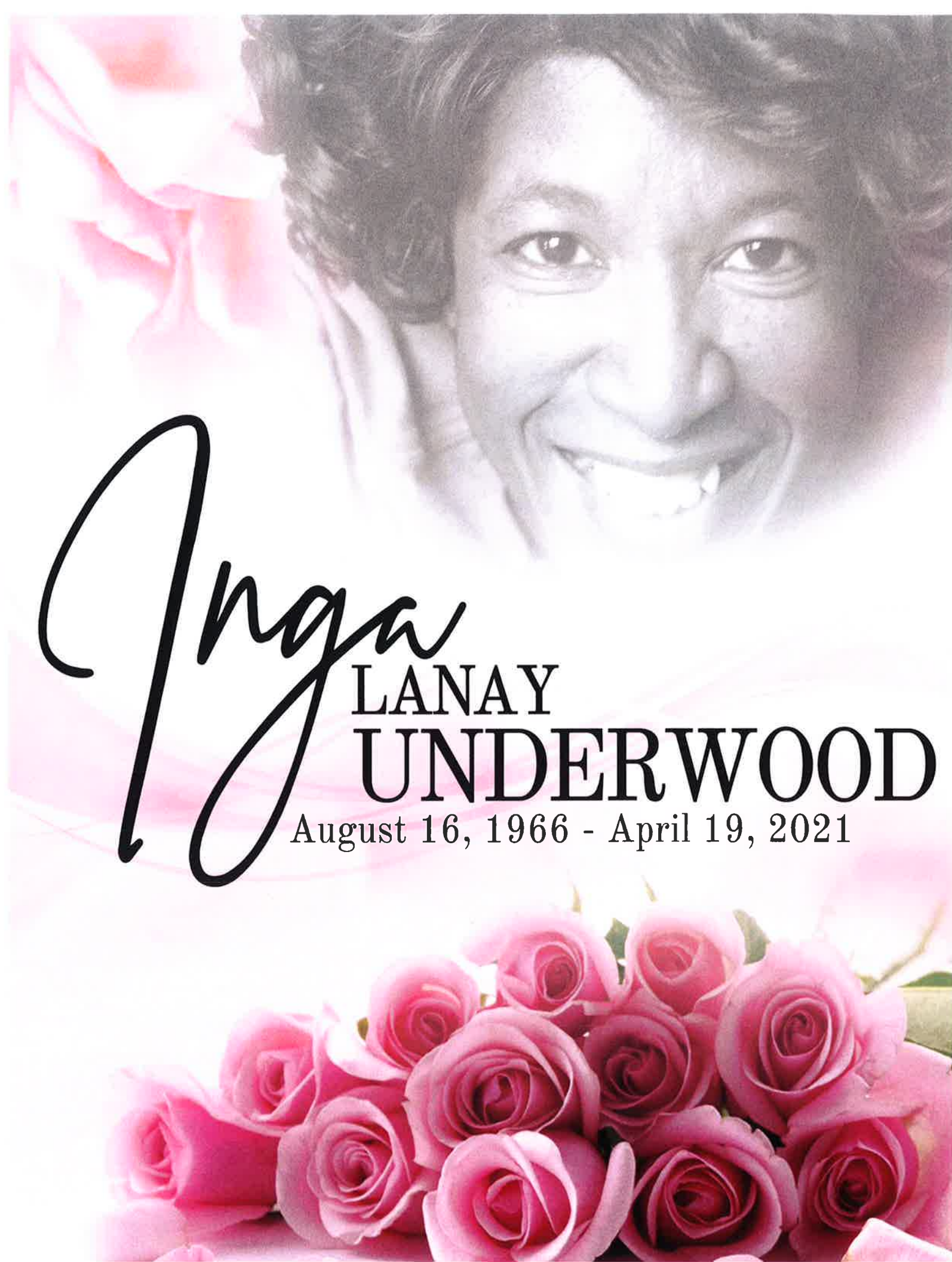

And if you listen with your heart, you will hear

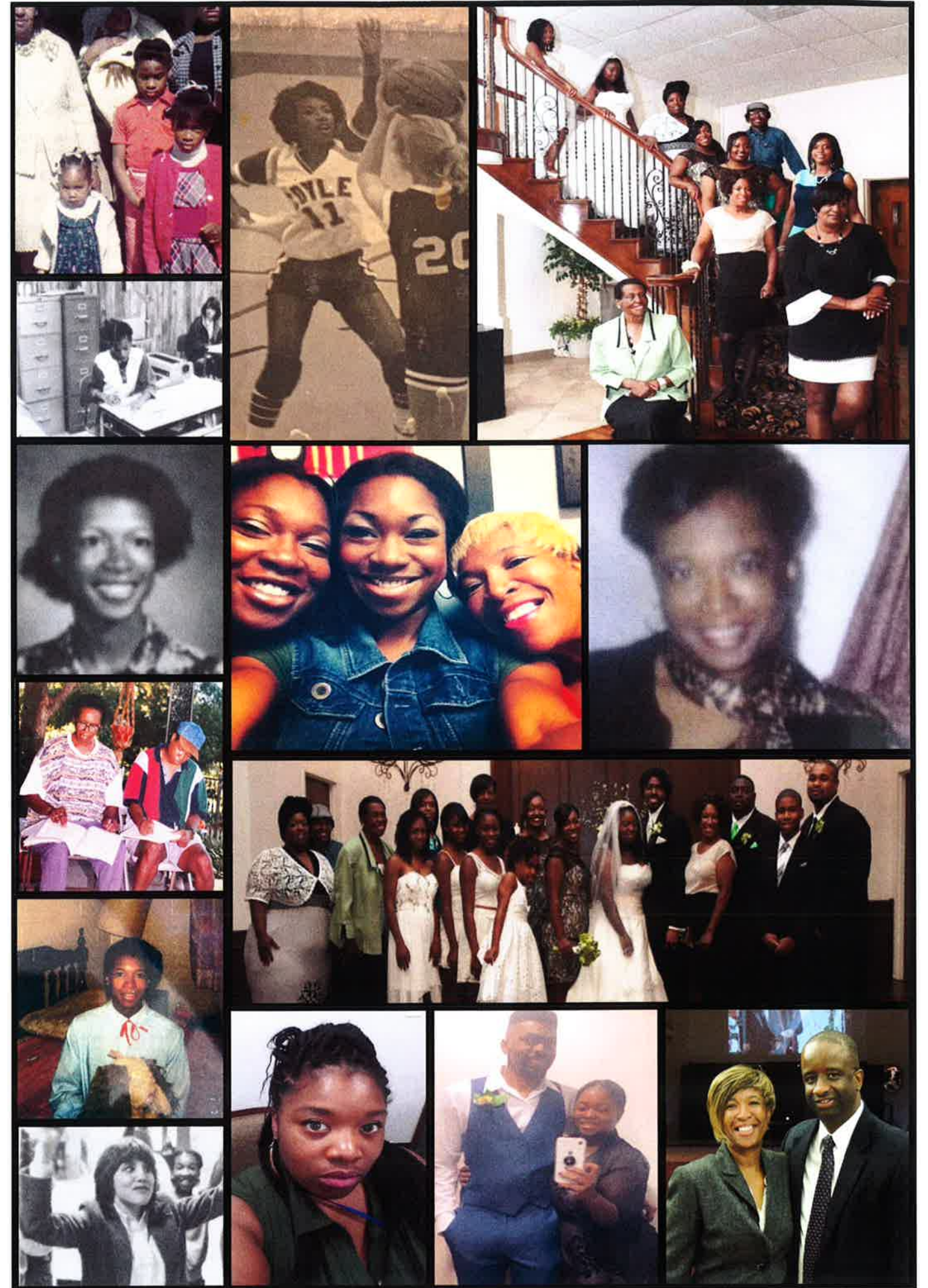

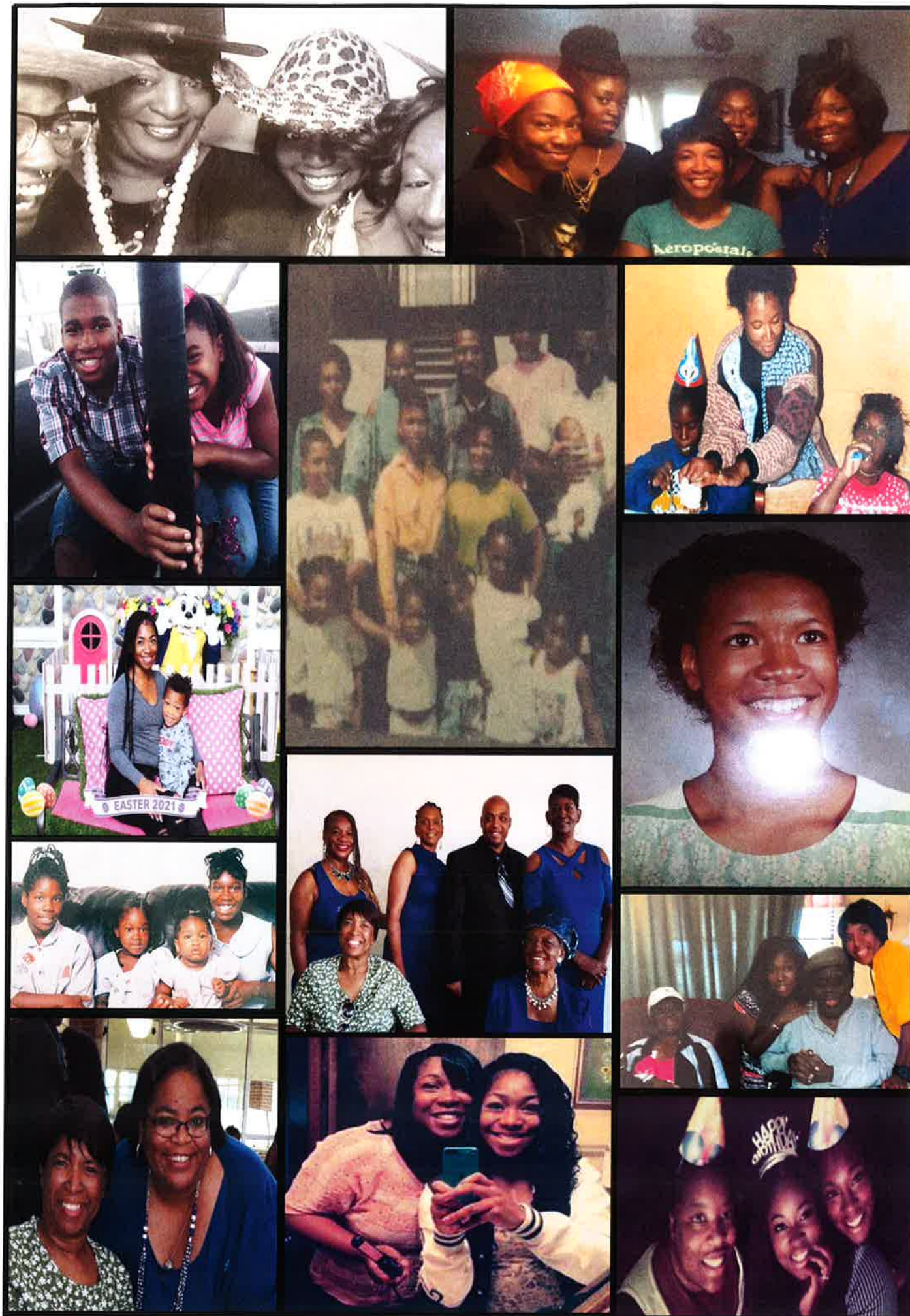
