He also volunteered at Skyline Urban Ministries with his Aunt Nett where he helped with breakfast for the elderly and the back-to-school bash for the children.

In October 2011, his father married Kathryn and that union gave DeAngelo four more siblings and a stepmother that he adored. He was lovingly known to his new family as “Django”.

He loved to go thrift store shopping and to garage sales with Kathryn, it was their thing.
