

Obituary

Winford Durnell Shelton was born on September 27, 1942 to Isaiah "Buster" Shelton and Evelyn (Davis) Shelton in Boley, OK. He was the fourth of eight children born to this union.

Winford attended school graduating from Boley High School Class of 1960. After his graduation he ran as fast as he could to Oklahoma City. Winford would share how upon his arrival to Oklahoma City the many miles that he walked in those early days to apply for jobs and landing one in a kitchen only to quit the same day. He simply had bigger aspirations to pursue. But in February of 1964 he was drafted into the US Army to serve time in Vietnam like so many others. He was able to return home between training long enough that on May 7, 1964, he married the love of his life, Adrian J. Thornton. After completing his tour by the grace of God, he returned home with an honorable discharge in February of 1966 to his loving wife.

Winford D. Shelton and Adrian J. Shelton were married for 57 years and to this union five children were born: Victor L. Shelton, Kenneth J. Shelton, Winford D. Shelton, Jr., Edward D. Shelton, and Kita L. Shelton. He brought a child into their union, Reggie E. Richburg.

Winford was affectionately known from childhood by his family and friends as "Black or Zeke." Winford was a loving husband and father that believed in working hard. He embraced all that was expected and required of a man as the head of his household. Winford, for many years, worked tirelessly to be a constant provider for his family. He also made it clear to his kids that nobody owes you anything. He stressed setting goals and being prepared to work hard to achieve them.

Winford loved to share stories of his childhood growing up with his siblings, picking cotton and peanuts, and raising the family's livestock. He also helped neighbors in order to make whatever money he could. Early on he settled into a technical trade and began working for a company that manufactured oil field supplies. Three months later he was on to a job paying more money at Tinker Air Force Base to help him better provide for his family. He would work as a Civil Service employee for many years eventually securing the position of Aviation Mechanical Inspector that required attention to detail and gave him the challenges he needed daily. After his retirement from Tinker Air Force Base, he continued to work other jobs to stay busy. He was a very proud family man and equally proud of his children.

Both of his parents and siblings — Wilbert, Asalene, Viola, Theola, and Sylvia — preceded him in death.

He is survived by his wife, Adrian J. Shelton; children: Reggie Richburg of Oklahoma City, OK, Victor L. Shelton (Venise) of Ocala, Florida, Kenneth J. Shelton, Winford D. Shelton, Jr. (Kerri), Edward D. Shelton (Cessnie), and Kita L. Shelton (Mike), all of Oklahoma City, OK; his siblings, Eloise Bowler and Ronald Shelton (Francis); and a host of grandchildren, great-grandchildren, nieces and nephews.
