

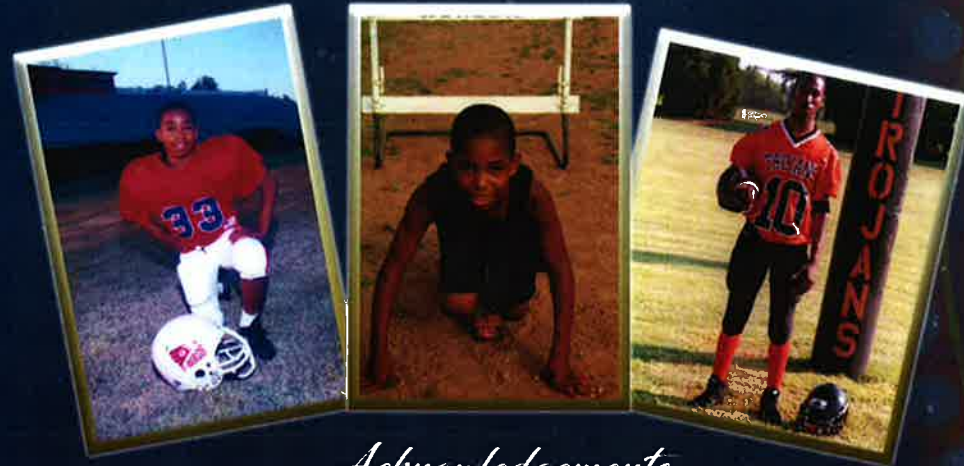

Life is but a stopping place, a pause in what's to be, a temporary resting place along the road to sweet eternity. We all have different journeys, different paths along the way. We all are meant to learn somethings, but never meant to stay. Antonio has claimed his greater reward and found an everlasting peace together with the Lord.

Antonio LaMark Walker began his journey on November 21, 1984, born to Kenneth Walker and Toni Walker Sheperd in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

Antonio was baptized at a young age. He was a member of Progressive Baptist Church. He graduated from Douglass High School in May 2003. In the fall of 2003, he attended Oklahoma City Community College to pursue his college degree.

Antonio was a student athlete. He had a passion for football and track field. He began competing at the young age of five years old. He was afforded the opportunity to run and compete around the United States as one of the original Eastside Steppers. He was an exceptional, and very talented runner. For his build and physique, he had a long stride, and greater upper body strength. He competed and became an All American in track and field. He competed in several races including the 800M, 1500M, 1600M relay and 3200M relay. Standing five feet and six inches tall he had the heart of a lion and swore he was a giant.

Antonio had a smile that would light up any room. A proud father, with a confident demeanor. He was very protective of his family. He loved hard. Antonio enjoyed spending time with family and friends. He loved to watch his daughter Ahoneste compete on the basketball court. They shared the common bond of competitiveness that most student athletes possess. He would publicly post and share her accolades both in the classroom and on the court. He enjoyed sharing pictures of his beautiful children with the world. He loved to listen to music, freestyle, write, and play the video game.

At the age of 21 Antonio experienced pain and tragedy. He became a paraplegic. Although it altered his life forever, he displayed great strength while continuing to persevere through the emotional, physical, and mental battles that came along with traumatic experience. His tenacity was inspiring, and very commendable. He spent the last fifteen years of his life pressing forward towards the mark of acceptance, healing, and peace until he was called home on August 27, 2021

He was preceded in death by his father Kenneth Walker, maternal grandfather Eldridge Wyatt, and paternal grandparents McKinley and Annie Walker.

He leaves to cherish his precious memory his three children Ahoneste Walker, Antonio Walker Jr., Autumn Walker; Mother Toni Walker Shepherd; Stepfather Bernie Pruitt; Sisters RaeShauna Walker Elmore (Donavan Bell), and Kenneshiya Roberts; Brothers Kenneth Walker, and Robert Pruitt. Maternal Grandmother Darlene Wyatt whom he shared a special bond with, and a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, relatives, and friends.
