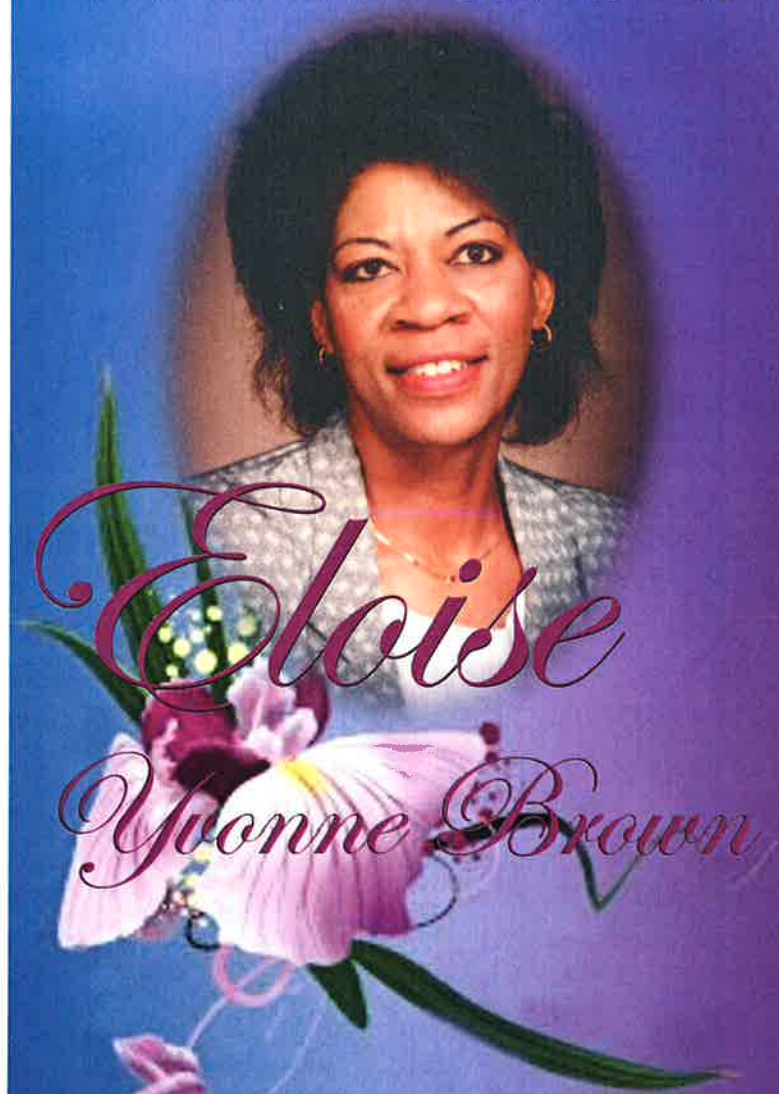

Obituary

ELOISE YVONNE BROWN was born to Grace Argrow and Robert Brown on September 25, 1945 in Stroud, Oklahoma. She was the only child born to this union. After graduating high school, Eloise moved to Oklahoma City, this is where she met and married the late Clarence Meadows on September 26, 1966. To this union two children were born and she helped raise two stepchildren.

While attending Stroud Public Schools, she played basketball, volleyball and softball. She was the first black female to make the All-Star All-State Team and the first black female to be HCQ or Queen Attend.

Eloise later went to Langston University where she received a Bachelors degree in Corrections with a minor in Psychology. She continued her education and received her Master's in Criminal Justice from the University of Central Oklahoma. Eloise loved education and pushed those around her to go to college.

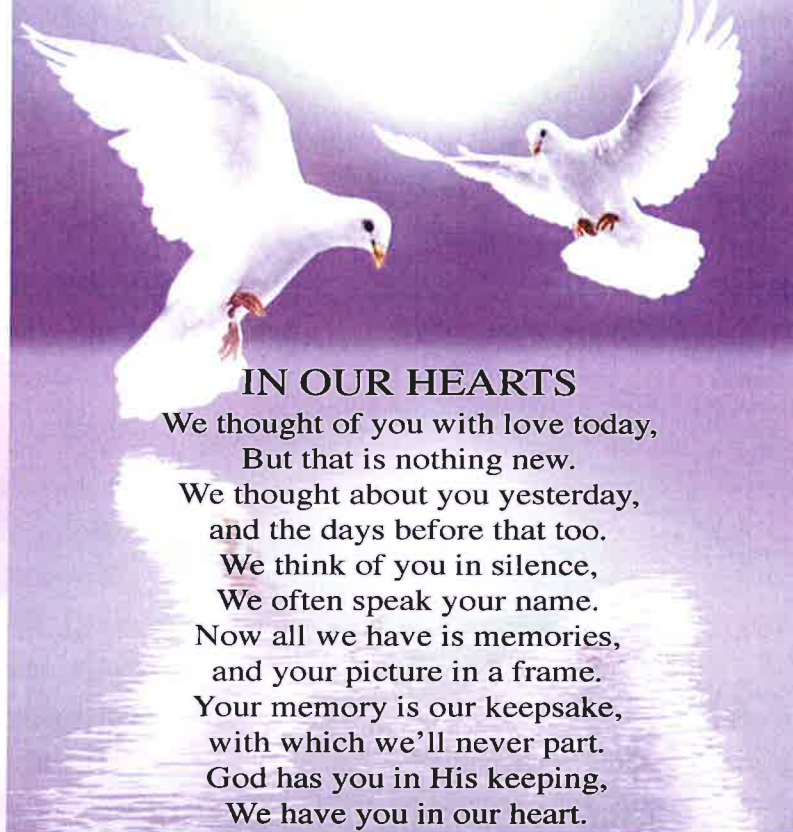
Eloise was employed with the State of Oklahoma, serving 27 years, starting in the Mailroom, then Construction and Properties, also at Dick Connors where she was known as "Moses" and last, Probation and Parole. She retired in 2009 to help with her great grandchildren and travel.

Eloise accepted Christ at an early age under the leadership of Pastor Looney at the St. Peter Baptist Church in Stroud, Oklahoma. After moving to Oklahoma City, she attended Christ Temple where she received the precious gift of the Holy Ghost. In 1972, she joined Greater Shiloh Baptist Church where she served faithfully

and was a choir member, until her health declined. Eloise loved the Lord and she loved to sing and serve.

Eloise was preceded in death by her grandparents, parents, three brothers, one sister, daughter and a grandson and other family members.

Eloise leaves to cherish her memories two children: Tamitha Anderson (Robert Jr.), and Cortez N. Meadows; two stepchildren: Dennis J. French (Cynthia) and Ted Jackson; three sisters: Constance A. (Wilford), Deborah Roberts, Rita Brown; two brothers: Calvin Brown (Marlena), Robert Brown Jr. (Angela); ten grandchildren, four great grandchildren, and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
