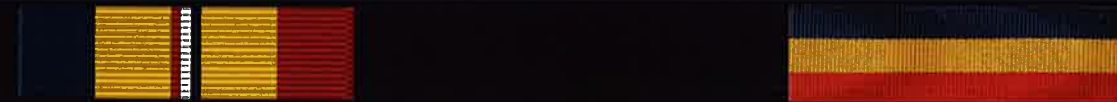

Our hearts are broken because you are no longer here with us. Words can not express how much we are going to miss you.

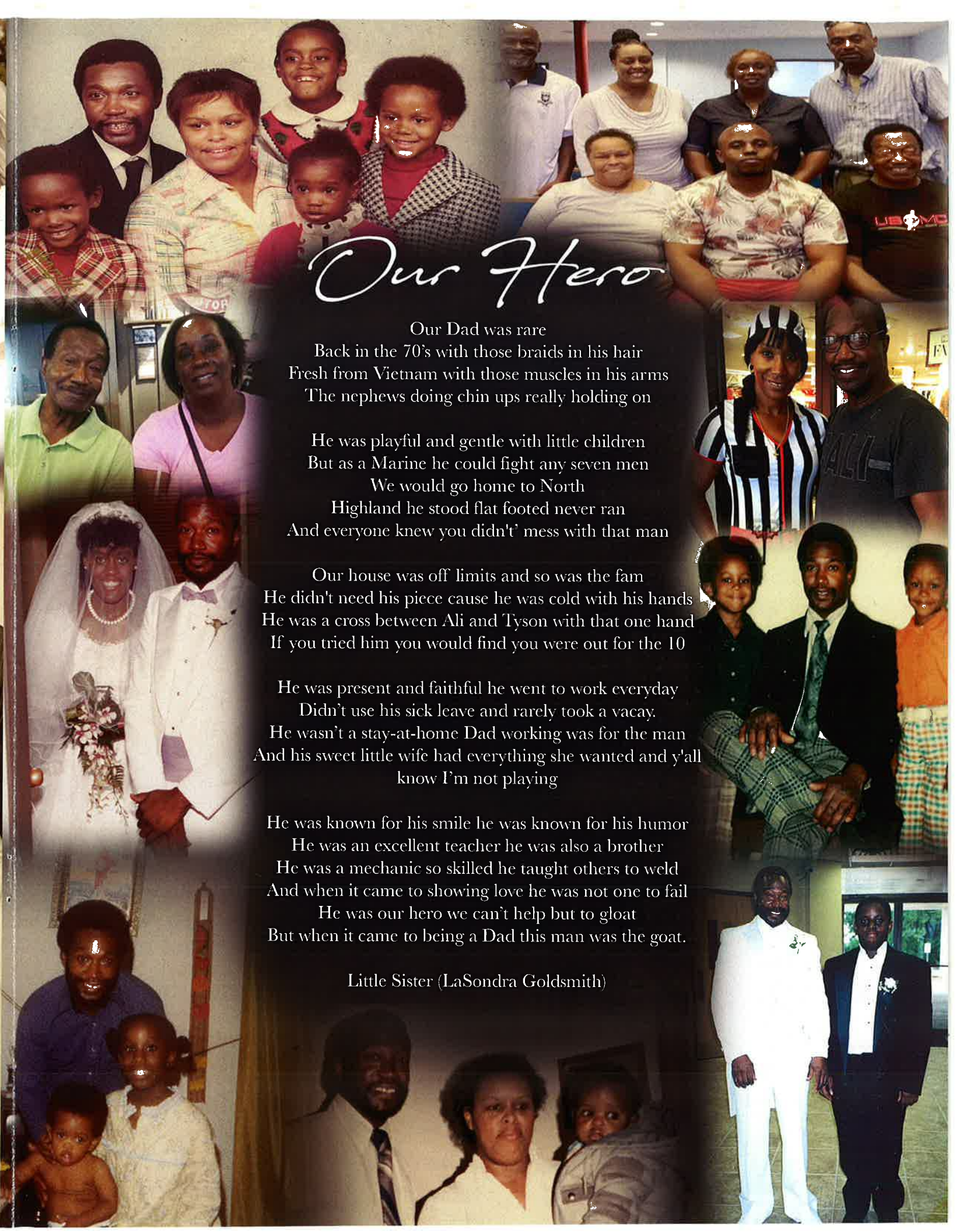
Since the first day I met you, there has not been a day that you have not loved and cared for me and our family.

The nephews doing chin ups really holding on

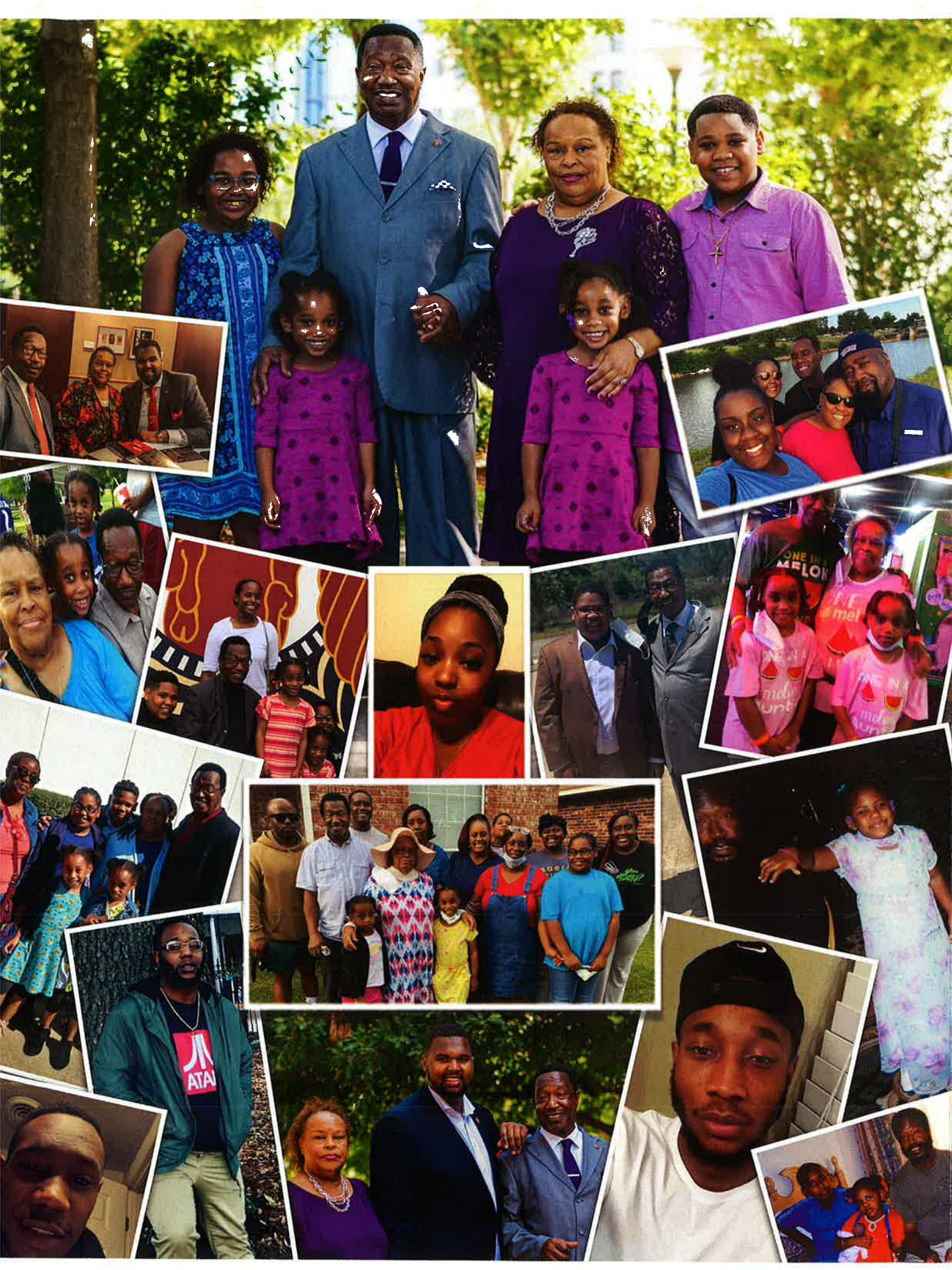
He was playful and gentle with little children

# The life of FRANK ODEAN GOLDSMITH



Frank Odean Goldsmith was born December 12, 1946, to Otis and Frankie Goldsmith in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Frank attended Oklahoma City Public Schools including Douglass High School. He also attended: Central State College, Oklahoma State University, and vocational schools, where he became proficient in welding and later taught welding at Opportunities Industrialization Center (OIC) of Oklahoma County, Guthrie Job Corps, and the Oklahoma City Skill Center. Frank also worked at Tinker Air Force Base as an Automated Welder Operator, where he retired after over 20 years of service.

In 1967, Frank joined the United States Marine Corps where he received a Purple Heart Medal, Combat Action Ribbon, Presidential Unit Citation with two bronze stars, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Meritorious Unit Citation (Gallantry Cross Color), Republic of Vietnam Meritorious Unit Citation (Civil Actions Color, 1st Class), Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.

In 1974, Frank was baptized in Jesus' name and filled with the Holy Ghost at Bethlehem Prayer Mission under the pastorate of Evangelist Gloria and Elder Curtis Mitchell. Frank later became a member of First Deliverance Church (Temple), where he was



a faithful member for over 40 years. He served as a member of the Pastor's Choir, a Deacon, and a member of the Executive Board.

On July 5, 1974, Frank married Judy Ann Mayes and they were loving parents to six children. They always went above and beyond to care for their children as well as their nieces, nephews, and children in the neighborhood.

Frank was known for his kind heart and loving smile. He was known for his take charge attitude, and military heroism when it came to protecting his family and friends. Frank loved his entire family and took care of everyone assigned to him. Frank was a hard worker and always provided for his family.

Frank was preceded in death by: his father Otis Goldsmith, his mother Frankie Goldsmith, Sisters: Brenda Arnold, Alice Goldsmith-Cobbs, Janice Goldsmith, brothers: Claud Goldsmith, Otis Goldsmith Jr, and Richard Goldsmith.
