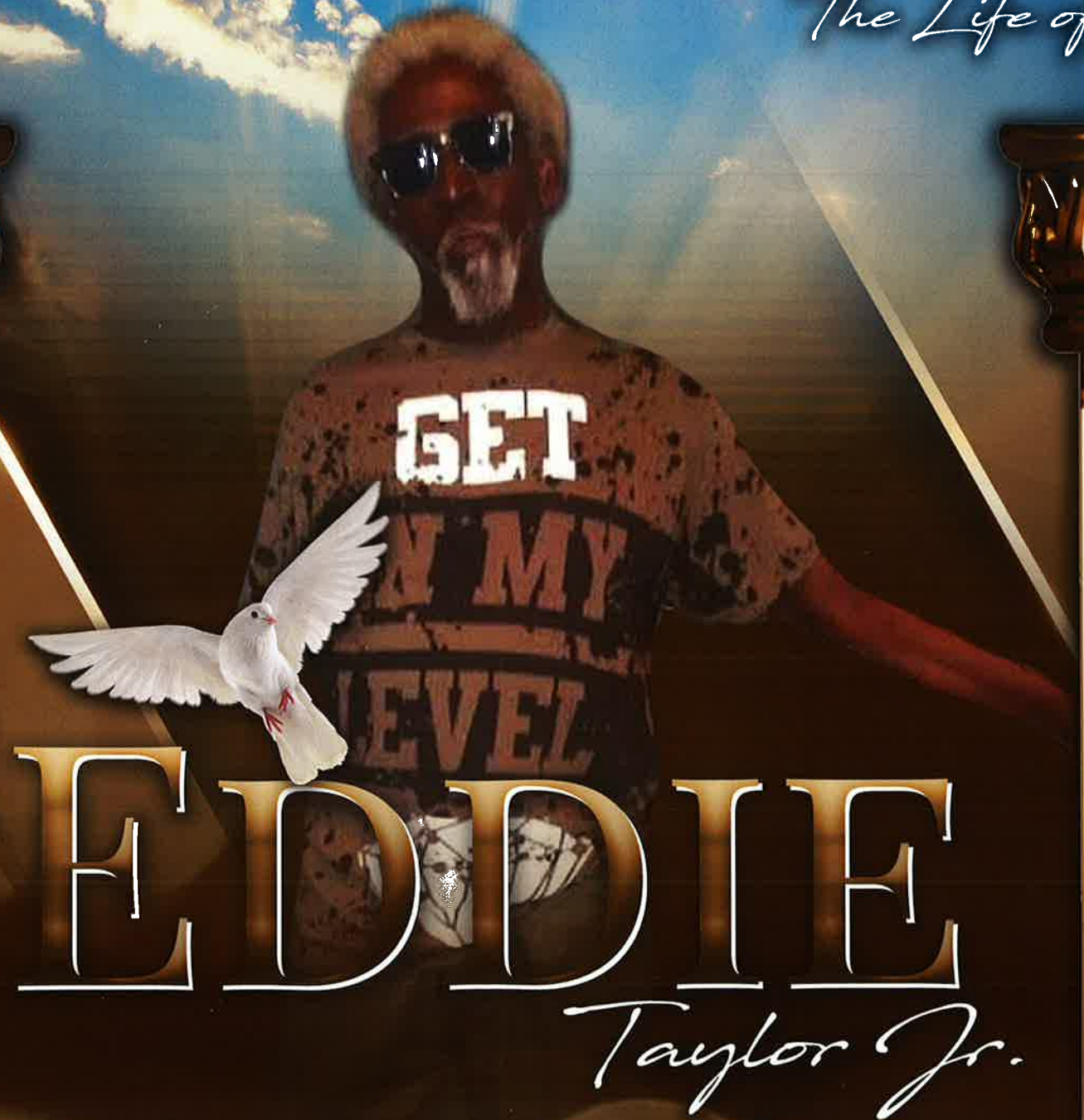

Eddie Taylor was born on July 27, 1951 to Delois Taylor and Eddie Morrie in Memphis Tennessee.

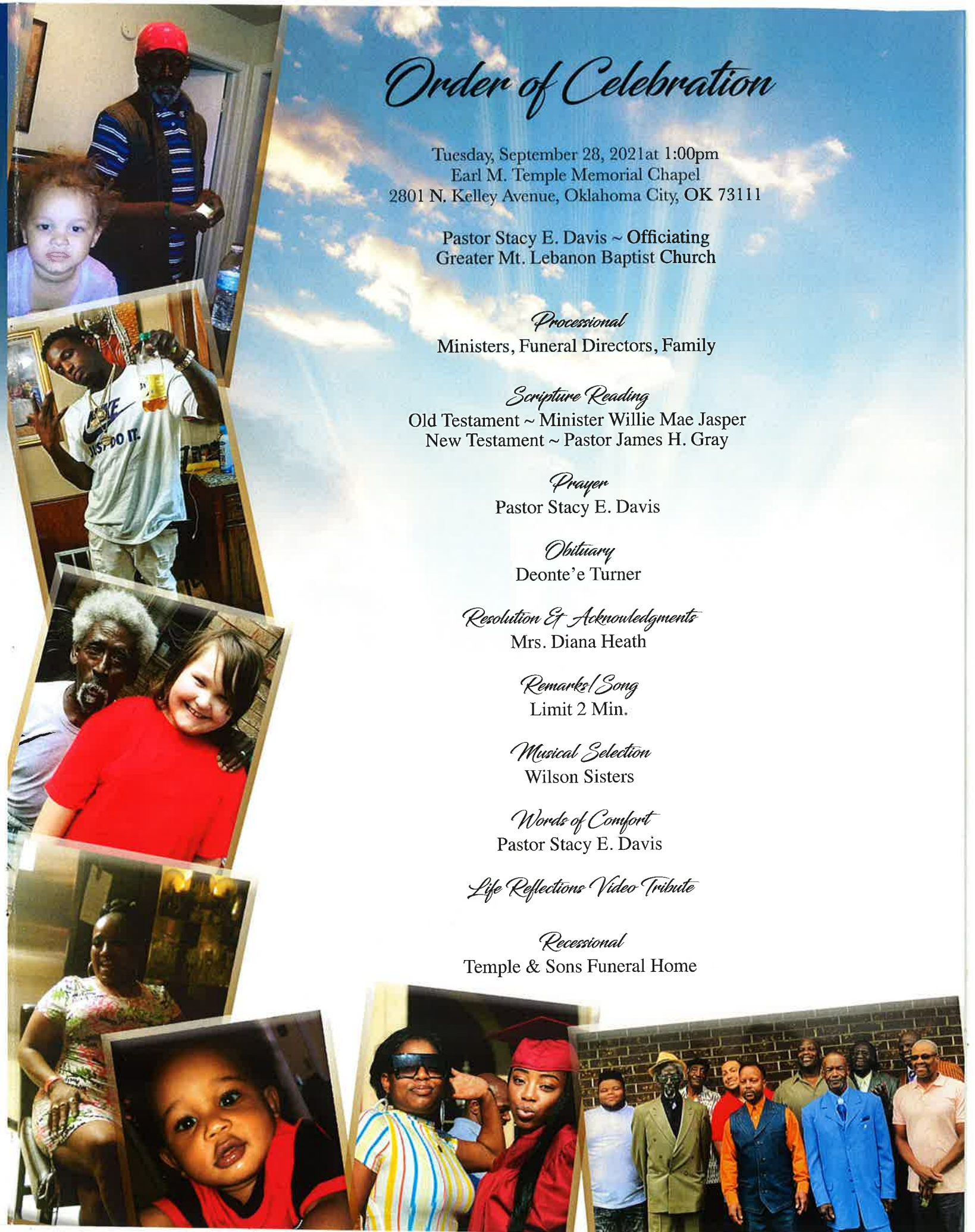

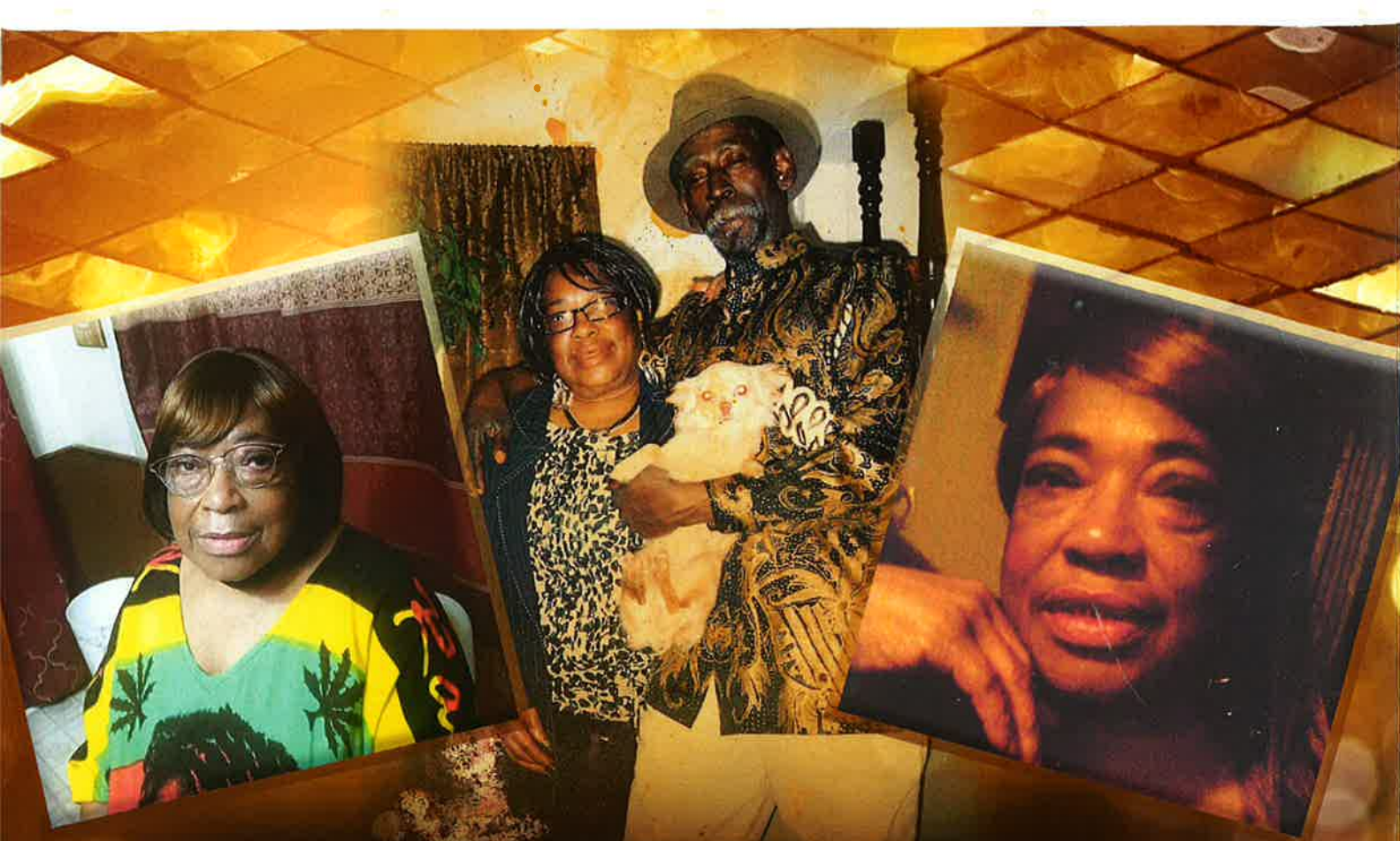

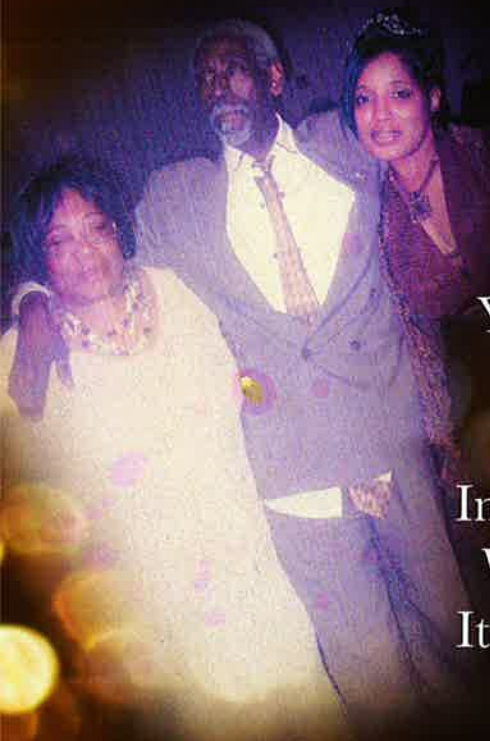
