Evie Joyce Morris was born to Reverend Percy Ville Richardson and Grace Barnett Richardson, July 16, 1938. Her father and mother preceded her in death, as well as an older sister, Grace Mae Duke Anderson.

Evie Joyce united with the Antioch Baptist Church in Luling, Texas and was baptized at the age of three by the late Reverend Robinson, Pastor. After accepting the Lord, she began her service through singing in the children's choir, providing secretarial support to the Sunday School Department, and progressing into an Usher as well. Later, she started playing the piano and she was the first youth choir musician for the Friendship Baptist Church of Luling, Texas. She studied music under the late Cleo Hyshaw who was a music and school teacher. After completing elementary school, she moved to San Antonio, Texas and attended St. Peter Claver Academy, where she graduated from high school at the age 16. Evie then moved to Los Angeles, California, July of 1956 to live with her aunt (name sake) Aunt Evie to attend college. Immediately upon arriving in Los Angeles, she united with the Morning Star Baptist Church, where Reverend P.J. Ellis was pastor. While there, she continued to sing and play piano while providing choral support to the Youth Choir. She received an A.A. degree in business from Los Angeles City College. Following graduation from City College, she enrolled at Sawyer School of Business where she received a diplomas as an "Intensive Secretary of Science." While attending school, she met and married Leroy Gaddis/ To this union two children were born, Marva Annette and Jerrell Petrosky. Years later, she met and married Aris G. Morris. To this union one child was born, Sheila Denise. Later, she began directing choirs all over the greater Los Angeles area, including the New Landmark District Association of the Western Baptist State Convention, Los Angeles, California.

Evie worked for the Federal Government for 32 years at the West Los Angeles medical Center (Veterans Affairs Hospital), where she worked until retiring November 29, 1996. She received numerous awards during her service.

Her father, mother, sister, aunts, uncles and grandparents, all preceded her in death.
