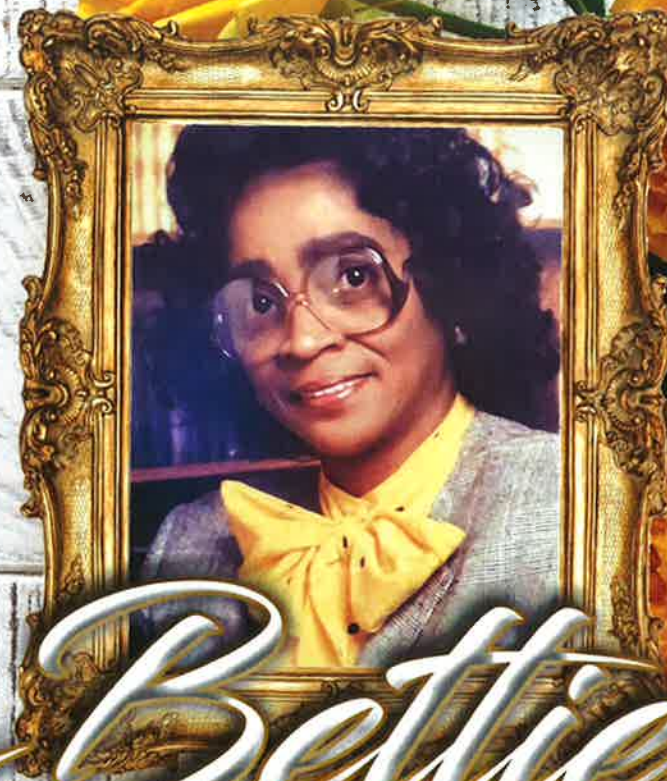

Obituary

Bettie Lou Madison was one of two children born to William C. and Gracie Mac Moore on February 18, 1928. Bettie Lou was preceded in death by her parents, her sister, and husband of 53 years. All were residents of Oklahoma City. Bettie lives a full and eventful life. Bettie migrated to Oklahoma City from Austin, Texas where she met and married Lonzo Willie Madison. From their union, five children were born. Bettie prayed that she would see her youngest, Richard, finish high school and graduate from college. Her prayers were answered, in addition to her living a full and prosperous life.

As a young mother and caring for three growing boys, Bettie sought to advance her education by attending Draughon's School of Business while working at University Hospital as a nurses assistant and laboratory assistant, simultaneously. Bettie was an avid proponent of higher education. After Draughon's School of Business, she earned three degrees after the three older children were grown and married with children.

She achieved her Certificate of Executive Secretary and Administrative Assistants in 1976; in addition to being awarded the Certificate of Mastery in Banking and Finance in 1993 and received her degree of Associate in Applied Science in Finance in 1994.

Bettie's eclectic career began as a Laboratory Assistant and Nurses Aide at University Hospital. She later became the Administrative Secretary at Avery Chapel, then becoming the Secretary at Truman Elementary School, and finally becoming the Financial Executive Secretary at Medical Center State Bank. Bettie concluded her career at Local Federal Bank, where she was an Auditor, keeping the banks records in check. Bettie retired after her youngest son, Ricardo, graduated from Alderson-Broadbudd College in West Virginia.

Bettie has left a tremendous legacy for her children, Grand children, and great grandchildren to attain. She was constantly encouraging her children, her grandchildren, and her great grandchildren to aspire to greater educational heights. She leaves to mourn her passing, five children: Daroll L.
