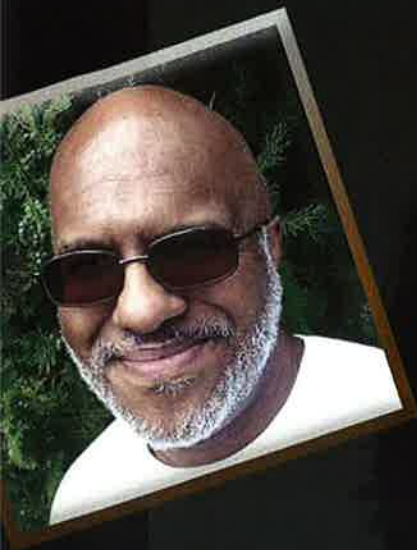
10 years later Rose met and married Sabbas Garza. To this union they had one child Raul Garza.
