






Don't be too sorrowful for me,



Obituary


Manzell McGrew, a proud father and Army Veteran departed on November 15, 2021. He was born in Paris, Texas on February 15, 1943 to the parents of Bill and Nollie McGrew. He is one of 8 children: Della McGrew, Gracie McGrew, Almeater McGrew, James McGrew, Charles McGrew (deceased), Ollie McGrew (deceased) and Alvin McGrew(deceased). After his father died at a young age, his mother relocated to Spencer Oklahoma. He attended Dunjee from elementary thru high school in Spencer, where he received his high school diploma.

In 1968, Manzell enlisted in the United States Army, where he spent 2 years active duty. After being honorably discharged, he began working at First National Bank, Oklahoma City. He also joined the United States Army Reserves for 28 years, where he achieved the rank of Sergeant First Class, fine tuning his skills as a chef - which later became a hobby. On July 9th 1972, He began a civilian federal career at Tinker Air Force Base, working for DISA (Defense Information Systems Agency), where he remained for 31 years; retiring in 2003. During the span of his career at Tinker, he served in the role of a Computer Programmer, Operations Monitor and Computer Operations Supervisor. He concluded his career as an Information Technology Specialist in the Systems Management Center of DISA's Enterprise Operations Division where he received numerous achievement awards. He believed in working, achieving and maximizing every skillset he had to build a successful career and provide a future for his son.

He accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior at True Vine Baptist Church where he was a member for 20 plus years; from childhood until an adult. He was very studious when it came to the Word of God. In the late 70's, he trained and provided a gateway for 27+ young adults from TrueVine to get hired in the computer industry at First National Bank. He served as active participant in BTU (Baptist Training Union); he led the bible drills and participated in crusades. He organized golf programs for the kids at True Vine through Tiger Woods' 1st Tee program. He later joined First Baptist Moore and was a member for the last 10 years. He was an active member of the CLASSICS Sunday schools group.

One of Manzell's greatest passions was working as a Chef in the Army Reserves. He loved to cook. During holidays, you could find him catering holiday events for clients, banks and golf clubs. He also developed a passion for golf at an early age. As a kid on the weekends, he would caddy for local golfers. One of his childhood highlights was getting the opportunity to caddy for PGA Golfer Arnold Palmer during a golf tournament at Twin Hills Golf Course in Oklahoma City. His love for golf developed and over the years he began playing in countless amateur and charity golf tournaments. He also served his community as a leader in the First Tee Golf Program, where he helped develop and fine tune golf skills for young kids. He was a luxury car enthusiast and a loyal football fan. He enjoyed spending quality time with his son and grandsons; enjoying games, car shows and teaching his grandchildren about golf.

Manzell is survived by his son, Christopher Michael McGrew; daughter-inlaw, Erika Blair McGrew; 2 grandsons, Christopher Londyn McGrew and Jonathan Sevyn McGrew; 1 brother, James McGrew; 3 sisters, Della Huntsman, Gracie Payton, and Almeater Griffin; 3 nephews, Roy Payton, Charles McGrew Jr, Meredith McGrew; 2 nieces, Amanda Besteda.
