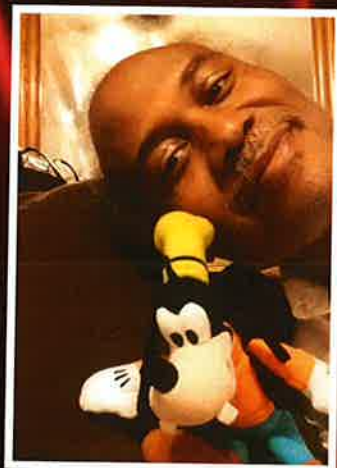

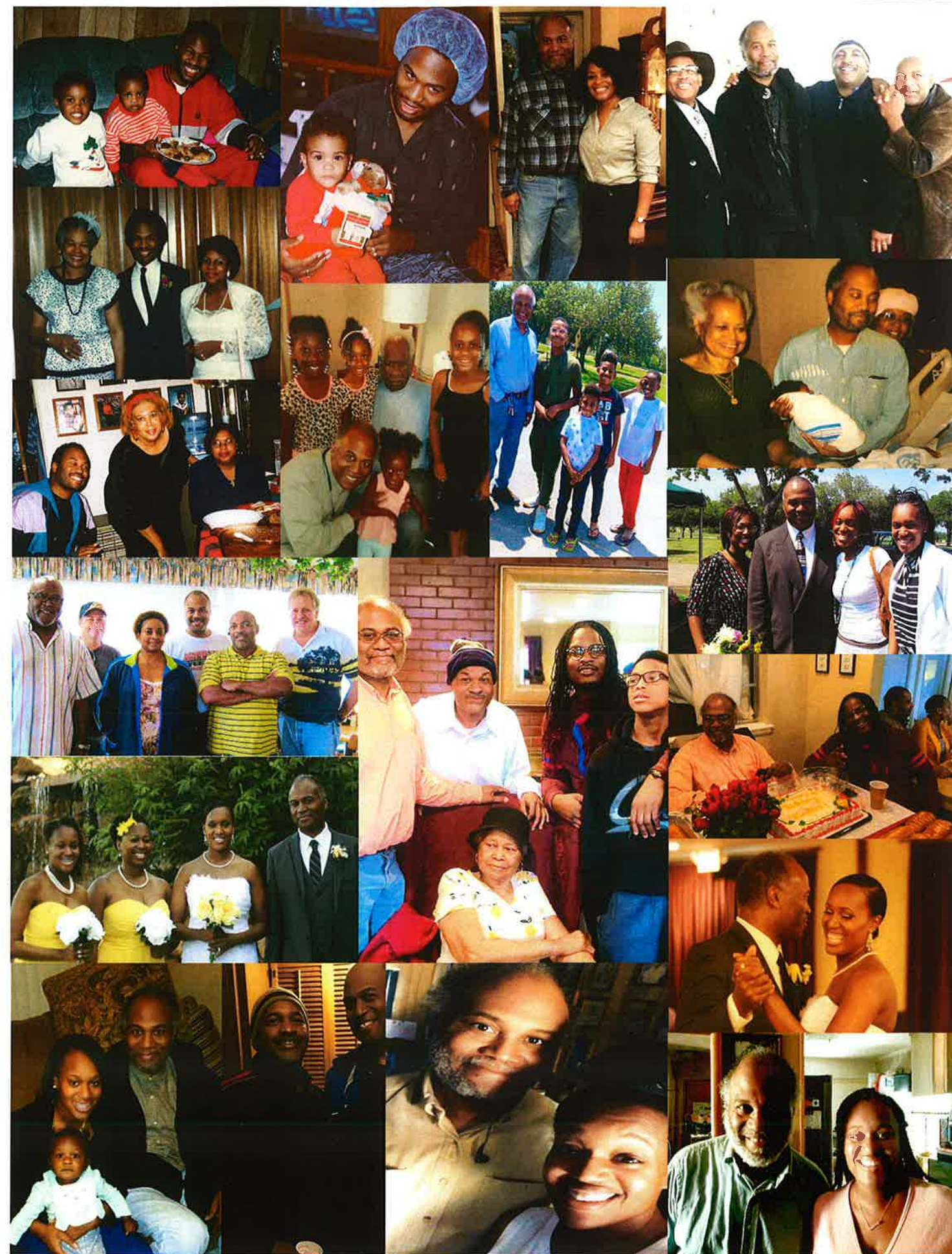

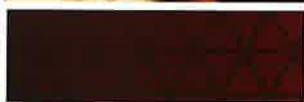
continued working in IT until his retirement in 2020 from American Fidelity.

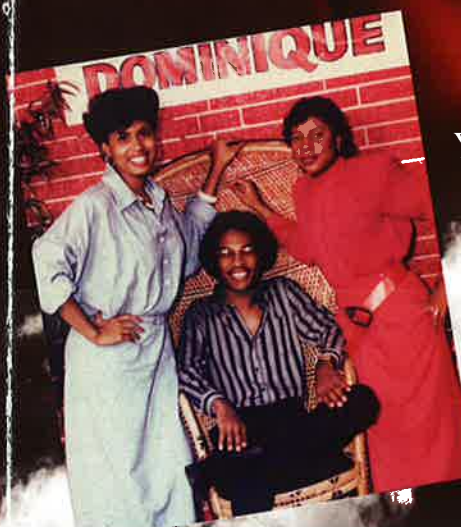
