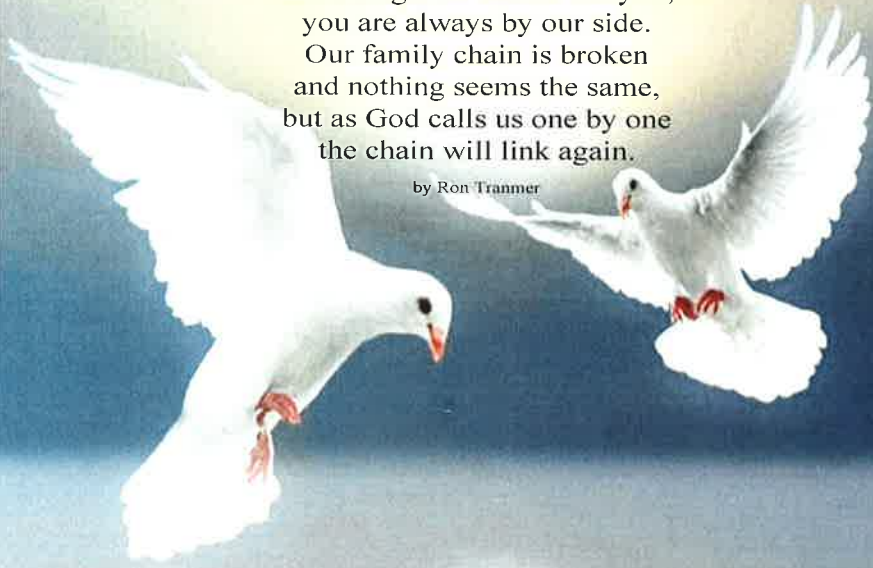


"The Broken Chain"


Obituary

Alfred Milton Luster Jr. was born on September 30th, 1963, in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Milton was the youngest and only son of four children born to Alfred Milton Luster Sr. and Wilma Jean Crutchfield Luster. Milton graduated from Star Spencer High School in 1981. He played for Star Spencer High School's football team from 9th to 12th grade. Upon graduating high school, Milton received a scholarship to attend the historically black University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff in Pine Bluff, Arkansas. While attending college, he played for their football team from 1981 to 1983. Milton had started his career working as an assembly line worker at the, formerly known, General Motors Assembly Plant in Midwest City, Oklahoma from 1983 to 1990. Afterwards, he moved to Addison, Texas and worked at the Texas Instruments manufacturing plant located in Dallas Texas from 1990 to 1993.

Milton was a big football fan and he enjoyed cheering on the OSU Cowboys, OU Sooners, and Pittsburgh Steelers. He also enjoyed wrestling, earning the nickname, "Ladd" as he was a big fan of the late professional wrestler Ernie Ladd. When he was not watching or talking passionately about sports, he was there to always help others in need. Milton was known to be very caring and would do as much as he could to support and take care of his family and friends.

On Wednesday, February 16, 2022, Milton was called away at the age of 58 to be with the Lord. He was preceded in death by his father Alfred Milton Luster Sr. and Sister Angela Yvette Luster. He is survived by his mother Wilma Luster and two sisters Jacqueline Harris (Will) and Alfreda Luster. He is also survived by his two aunts Doris Mukes and Norma Luster-Stevens.
