Philip Walter Johnson aka "Uncle Phil" was born January 12, 1950, to loving parents Mamie Lee Mosley and Silas Johnson in Atlanta Georgia. Mamie had three children with Philip being the middle child. He graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in May of 1968 and he was drafted into the U.S. Army June of 1968. He served our country by fighting in the Vietnam War.

Philip went on to receive multiple service awards including: a Vietnam Service Medal, 5 Campaign Medals, Vietnam Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary, National Defense Service Medal, 3 Overseas Bars, Good Conduct Medal 3rd Award (Can you believe Good Conduct lol), Purple Heart, and Army Commendation 1st Oak Leaf Cluster.

While in the military he continued his education by completing Unit/Organizer & Supply Processing Course in 1977, Medical Supply & Parts Specialist EXT. in 1979, and NCO refresher course in 1977. He later discharged with honors as an E5 Staff Sergeant from the Army June 20th, 1980.

Uncle Phil enjoyed going to the casino, playing dominoes, reading Western Novels by Louis L'Amour, he loved to eat & cook, playing reindeer games, and implied it was "The American Way and That's Law."

Uncle Phil was called home on March 17, 2022, preceded in death by mother Mamie Mosley-Bailey, father Silas Johnson, stepfather James Baily, brother Joseph Johnson, and Baby Sister who died during infancy.
