Don Aldern Walton, born to Lovie Marie Walton and QB Walton, both preceded him transitioning to heaven.

Don was the only child and grew up in Spencer, Oklahoma on Post Road. He joined Hillwood Baptist Church and later joined First Baptist Church in Hicks.

Don attended elementary school at Blessed Martin Catholic School in Oklahoma City, before attending Green Pastures, and attended Star Spencer High School.

His love for music lead him to the Gerald Dean School of Music, where he played the piano and sang. While attending the music school, his talent took him to Chicago to sing God Bless America at a Chicago Musical.
