

His Story

John Roy Moham, Sr. was born September 19, 1940 in Oktaha, Oklahoma, as the youngest boy of ten (10) children born to the parents of Robert and Nettie Moham.

He completed his secondary education at Rentiesville High School, graduating with the class of 1959. Following graduation from high school, he enlisted in the U.S. Air Force. He completed his tour of duty with an honorable discharge. While in the service he played basketball and was recruited to attend Grays Harbor College in Aberdeen, Washington to play on their men's basketball team. He obtained his Associate in Arts June 11, 1965, and went on to receive a Master of Education degree from Central State University, July 29, 1973.

Coming from a family who loves God, John was a faithful member of Avery Chapel AME Church. He truly loved his church family and served as a founding member of the Marcella Guthrie Scholarship Board. While on the board, a scholarship was created in the name of his daughter, Monica Moham, which is the highest scholarship awarded by the board. He was a charter member of Avery's

Food and Clothing Ministry and loved to share the Word of God while serving as the Sunday School Superintendent and Sunday School Teacher. During the Superbowl, you could always count on him serving as the auctioneer to raise money for scholarships during the half-time show. He brought his love for tennis and pickleball to the church, and served as an instructor during the summer program, donating pickleball equipment to the church. If you see the tape on the floor of the fellowship hall, just know John Moham, Sr. was there.

During this journey in life, he served for a short period as a postal worker until he found his calling in education at U.S. Grant High School where he taught geography and social studies until he was promoted to counselor. While working as a counselor, John had a great influence on the lives of many students, especially the black students, and particularly during the period of integration. Recently, one of his former students shared that "his encouragement and that smile kept many of us from going crazy. When we wanted to quit he wouldn't let us. He was truly an inspiration in our lives. He made attending Grant an easy transition!"

During his retirement, he rediscovered his love for farming; he became affectionately known as "Farmer John." If you wanted to see John you could find him either with his cows, dogs, or on a tennis court, until he found the world of pickleball. According to John, if you are not playing pickleball, you're missing out on big fun and good exercise. You need to start immediately.

There was a special kind of love brewing in California on June 29, 1966. John and his best friend, Frank Graves, decided to marry the loves of their lives on the same day two couples standing together at the altar of God! For over 55 years, John and Louvenia have loved each other unconditionally and put in the work God had for them to do. To this union three children were born: John Moham, Jr., Monica Moham, and Shauntae' Moham. He loved his children and likewise they loved him fiercely - BEYOND DESCRIPTION!

Our father was tenacious in his love for his family and his desire to keep us connected to one another! All of the HAMs (Oklahoma, Texas, Louisiana) held a special place in his heart. He looked like a kid in the candy store when everyone would come together. We will truly miss him serving as the host and cook, and in later years delegating the grilling to the younger generation, all coming together to make our family gatherings a place of great love, laughter, and fun.

John was preceded in death by several beloved family members including his parents Robert Moham, Sr. and Nettie Harris-Moham, three sisters: Ann Moham, Mary Shine, and Clevester Michael, four brothers: William Moham, Sr., Alan Moham, Robert Moham, Jr., and Charley Moham; and one beloved child, Monica Moham.

Living with many cherished memories and the task to continue his legacy are: his loving wife Louvenia of the home; two children John Moham, Jr. of Denver, Colorado, and Shauntaé Sourie (Eric) of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; one grandchild Josiah Moham; two sisters Dorthy Graves of Los Angeles, California, and Verna Moham of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; one god-daughter and god-grandchild, Sonya Shirley and Hydiah Williams, as well as a special friend Napoleon Moore, and a host of other relatives and friends.
