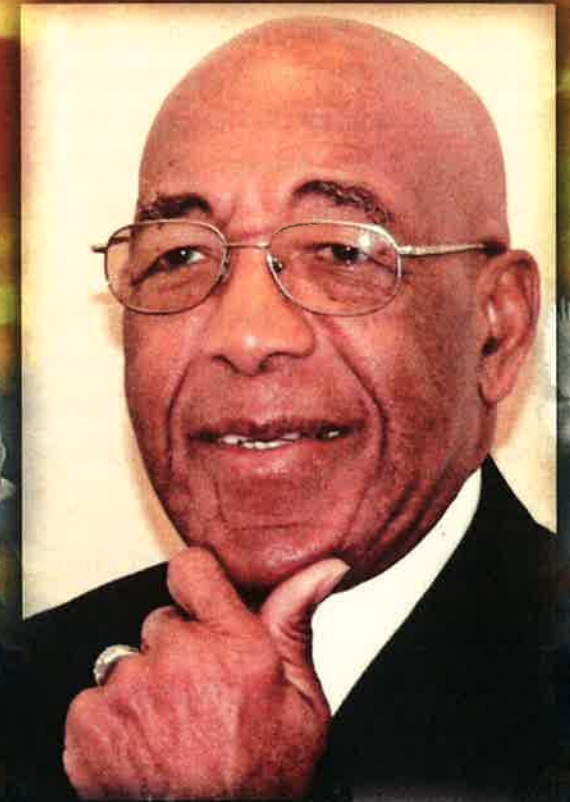

His Life Story

Adolph Brown was born June 5, 1927 to Julius Brown Sr. and Audney Brown in Chickasha, Oklahoma. He was the fifth child of six children. His parents and siblings preceded him in death.

Adolph graduated from Lincoln High School in Chickasha, Oklahoma. He joined the United States Army in 1947 and served during the Korean War. After his discharge, from the army, Adolph enrolled at Langston University and graduated in 1956 with a degree in Industrial Arts.

Adolph and Velda met in Chickasha in 1950. He later married the loved of his life. Adolph and Velda had three children: Sheila, Romina and Adolph. He and Velda were married for 57 years until she went to be with the Lord.

Adolph began his career with Tinker Air Force Base while attending Langston University. He worked in various positions and retired in 1990 as a Swing shift Supervisor. Adolph owned and operated a Janitorial Service and a full service Gas Station.

Adolph accepted Christ at an early age. His work in the C.M.E. Church continued faithfully until his death. Adolph was a devoted and faithful member of Greater Cleaves C.M.E. Church for over 50 years. He served in many roles including National Lay Leader, District Lay Leader, Ministry to Men, Trustee, Steward and Men's Choir member. Adolph was a Sunday School Teacher, Sunday School Superintendent, Boy Scout Leader, and he worked with Mobile Meals until he was 93 years old.

Adolph enjoyed all sports and was a former baseball coach. He was a member of the Langston University National Alumni Association. Adolph enjoyed spending time with his family, working in the church, and fishing.

If you knew Adolph, you knew he was, "too blessed to be stressed" and "too anointed to be disappointed."

Adolph went home to be with the Lord on April 10, 2022. He leaves to cherish his memory, daughters: Sheila Weary and Romina McBrayer; son, Adolph V. Brown (Stephanie); eleven grandchildren, fourteen great grandchildren, four great-great grandchildren; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
