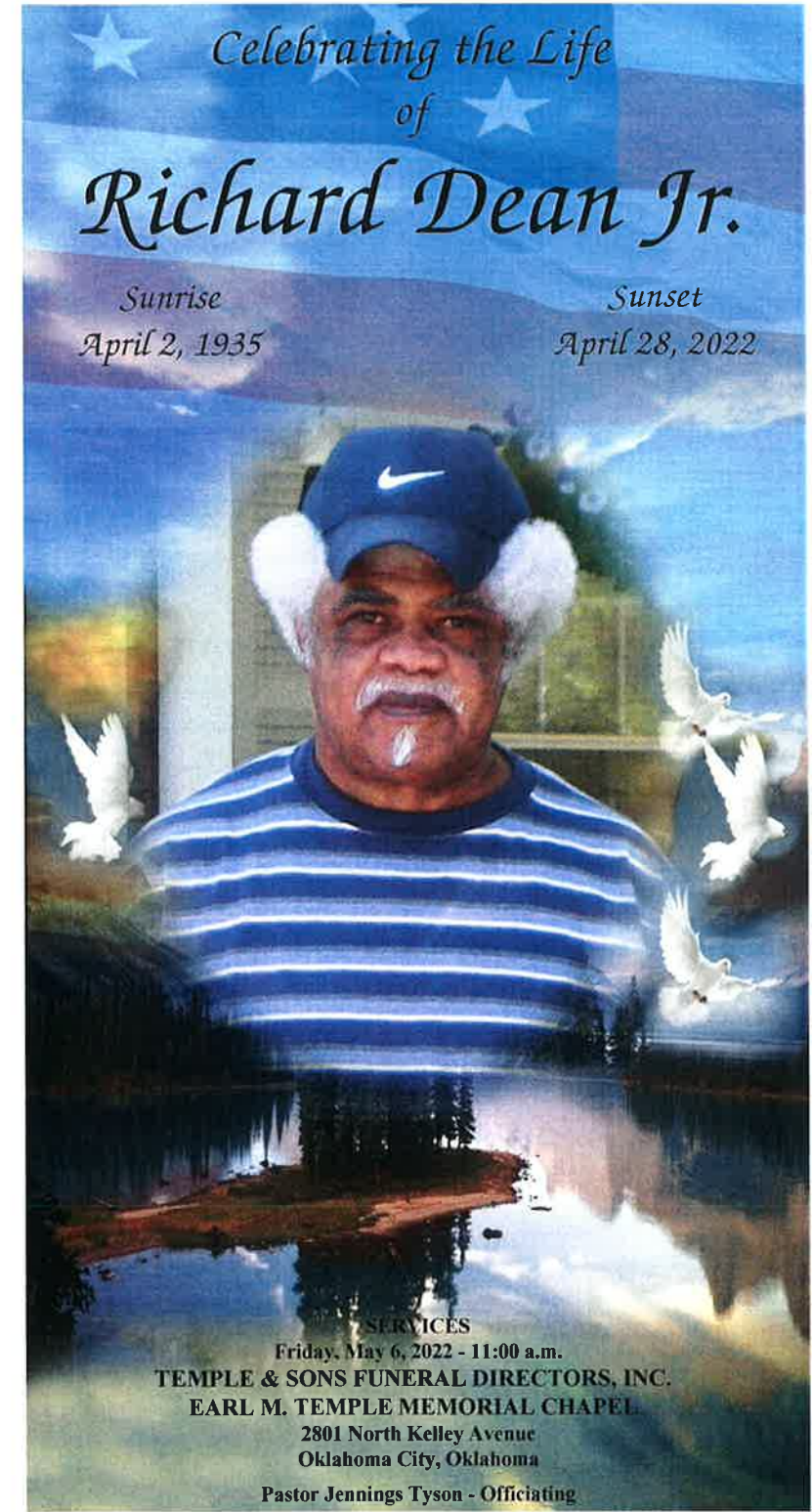

Obituary

Richard Dean Jr. or “Dean” as everyone knew him, came into this life on April 2, 1935. He was the second of eight children born to parents, Edith Johnson Dean and Richard Paul Dean Sr. in Duncan, Oklahoma.



He attended Douglass High School where he participated in many sports and social activities. Dean had a passion for golf and introduced it to his children at an early age but, one area he was most feared in . . .Dominoes! This earned him the nickname “Dangerous Domino Deano” AKA “The Dominologist.”

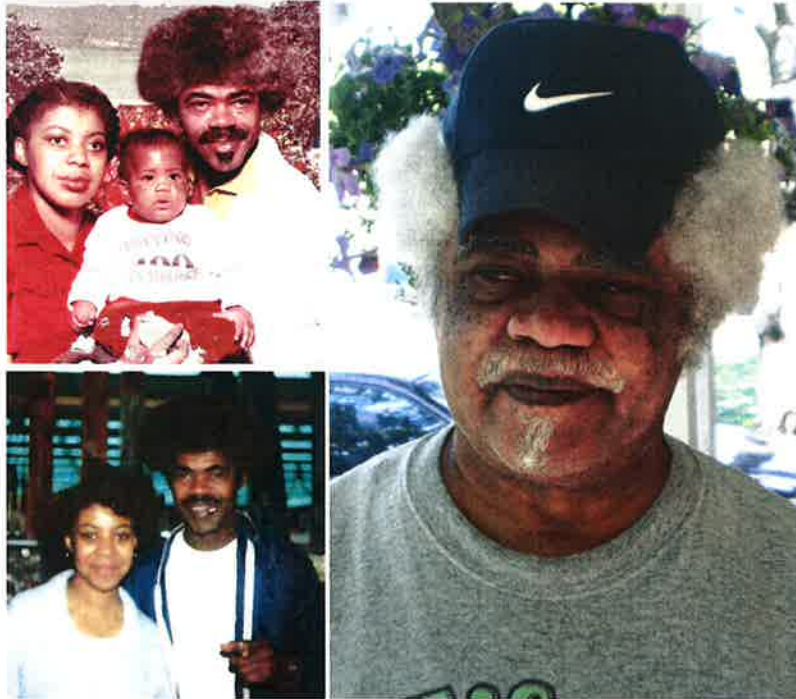
Dean entered the United States Air Force (USAF), April 22, 1954. Graduated Air Base Defense School, Parks AFB, CA, October 1954. Was stationed with Air/Security Police units at Elmendorf AFB, AK; Ardmore AFB, OK; McClellan AFB, CA; Kadena AB, Okinawa; Nellis AFB, NV; and Pease AFB, NH. Served with the 1st Military Police Group (Ryukyuan Armed Service Police) as patrolman and desk Sergeant in Camp Sukarian, Okinawa. Served three years Temporary Duty (TDY) and Permanent Change of Station (PCS) in Vietnam at Da Nang AB and Noncommissioned Officer in Charge (NCOIC), Special activities at Phu Cat AB. Follow-up assignments: Law Enforcement Flight Chief, Osan AB, Korea; NCOIC, Security Police Training, Tinker AFB, OK; and last assignment was Law Enforcement Corrections Supervisor, Lowery AFB, CO.

He was awarded Meritorious Service Medal (MSM) and Air Force Commendation Medal (AFCM) with two OLCs. Richard retired from USAF in 1974. He then spent another 25 years in civilian law enforcement and retired from the VA Medical Center Police (Supervisor) in 1999.

On Thursday morning, April 28, 2022, Richard quietly and peacefully answered the call of his Heavenly Father and

departed this life. He was preceded in death by the mothers of his children: Margie R. Warren-Dean, Cindy M. Hudson; sisters: Gladys Gaston, Mary F. Jackson, Jan Dean; brother, Emmanuel Dean; and daughter, Lakisha Dean.

Dean leaves behind to cherish his memory, one daughter Rolinda Dean; sons: Minister Tony Dean (Tonjla), Carnell Dean, and Richard L. Dean III (Andrina); sister, Brenda Holloway (Benjamin); brothers: Earnest R. Dean (Wanda), Leonard Dean; and a host of grandchildren and great grandson.
