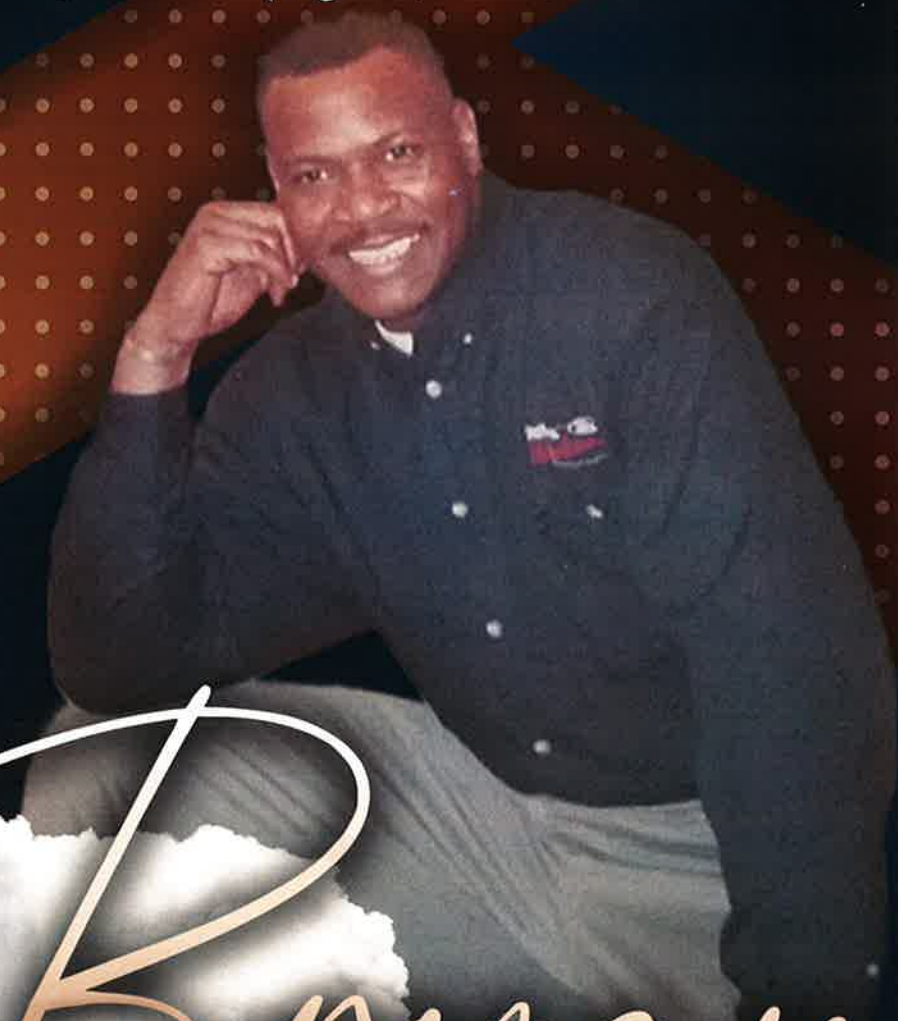

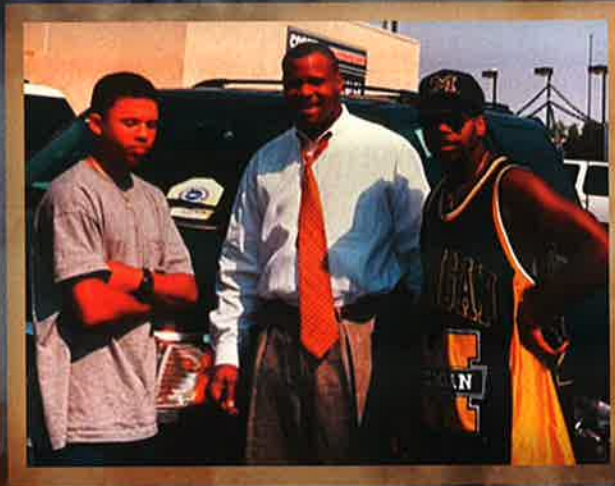
# In Loving Memory

Bryan Keith Campbell was the eldest son born to Ocie and Lillie (Moore) Campbell on November 17, 1959 in Oklahoma City. At an early age, he professed hope in Christ and was baptized at St. John Missionary Baptist Church of Oklahoma City. Bryan attended John Marshall High School, where he was a member and captain of the Men's Varsity Basketball Team, leading the Bears to a state Championship in 1978. After receiving his high school diploma in 1978, Bryan continued his education at Redlands Community College in El Reno, Oklahoma on an Athletic Scholarship.

As a young man he met and married Linda Marie Nelson February 14, 1985. The couple soon welcomed their first son Jerard. Being a hard worker, Bryan began his professional career in the automotive industry as a detailer at Jackie Cooper in Yukon, Oklahoma. He was promoted into car sales shortly after. In 1989, Bryan and Linda moved to Oklahoma City where they later welcomed their second son Jacob. Bryan later moved his family to southeast Oklahoma City and in 1991 and 11 months and 11 days there after welcomed their third and fourth sons, James and Josiah.

Bryan was an avid golfer and a closely followed professional golfer Tiger Woods. Bryan also loved basketball, having introduced the game to his sons while sharing his passion for the sport.

Bryan's parents both preceded him in death.
