Bettye Bridgette, affectionately known by many as Bettye B, was no stranger to the youth of the City of Oklahoma. Following God's calling to serve youth, Mrs. Bridgett was the founder of Bronzette Teens. This organization provided young girls an opportunity to build their confidence and relationship with others through pageants, which were held all over Oklahoma.

She was the head of the youth department at Friendship Baptist Church. It was there she started the well know Friendship Baptist Church Drill Team. Under her leadership, this amazing group of young people would not only form lifelong relationships, but would also win first place in the National Baptist Drill Team competition in Florida. In addition, she helped young children learn to speak publicly by grooming them to compete in oratorical contests held throughout the city.

Betty definitely had a heart for children. During a time when many of the youth were being killed at the hands of gang violence, she wrote and directed a play called Save the Children. The play encouraged its viewers to take a close look at the damage gang violence was having on young lives in the community. Her desire, as always, was to lead youth to Jesus. While serving as the youth director of Tabitha Baptist Church, Bettye wrote and direct Rennis, sinner spelled backwards. Bettye wanted everyone to know that trouble could find anyone, even good kids.

Throughout her life, Bettye touched the lives of many. However, her greatest love was her husband Tom Bridgett, who proceeded her in death. She cherished her grandchildren; Thomas Bridgett III, Michael Bridgett, Robert Harris Jr., Mykel Harris, Jordan Robertson, Paul Robertson Jr., one greatgranddaughter Brooklyn Bridgett and two greatgrandsons Michael Bridgett II, and Robert Marcus Harris III.

Bettye leaves to celebrate her legacy her 3 children, 6 grandchildren, 3 great grandchildren, 2 sisters Mary Lee Oliver (husband Lee John, deceased), Frances Lewis (husband Rickey), Franklin Cotton (wife Edie), and a host of nieces and nephews.
