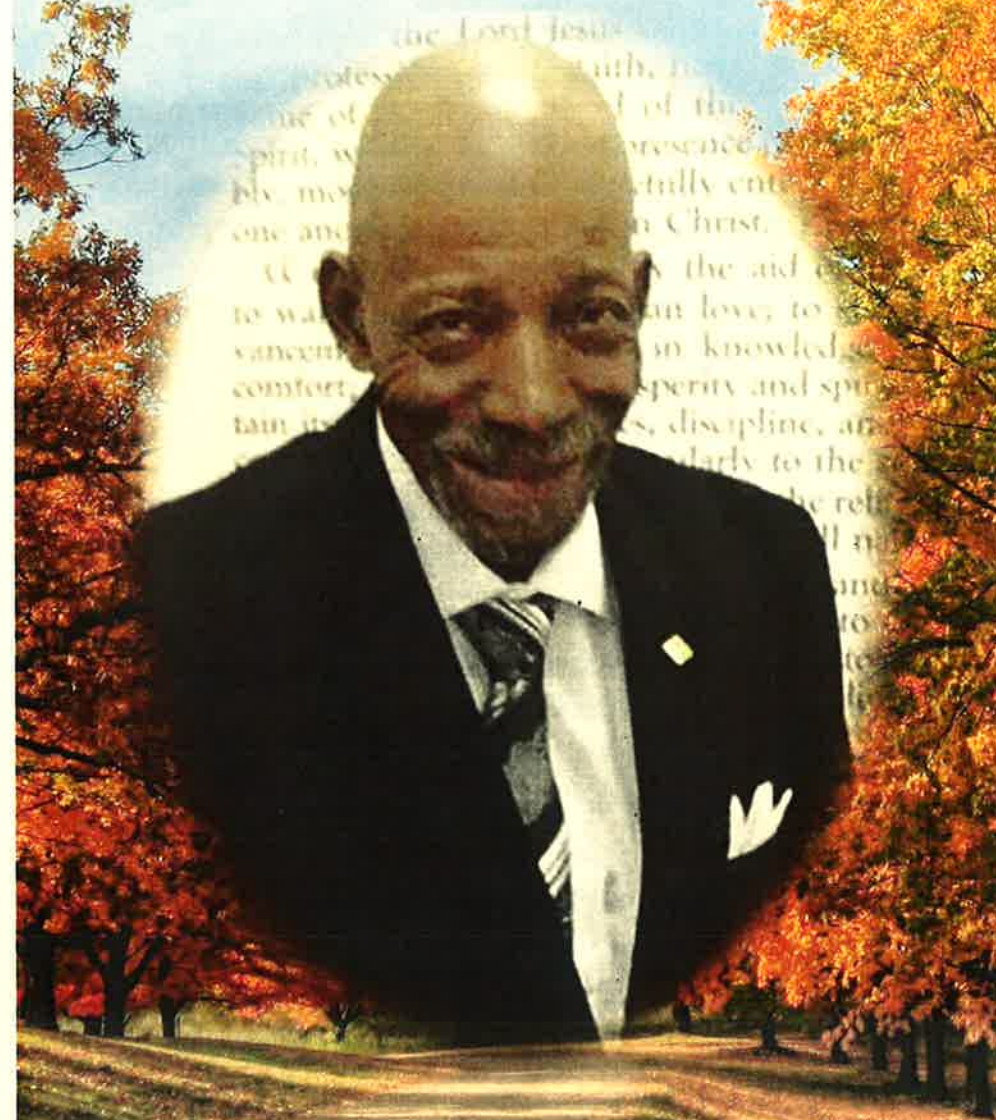

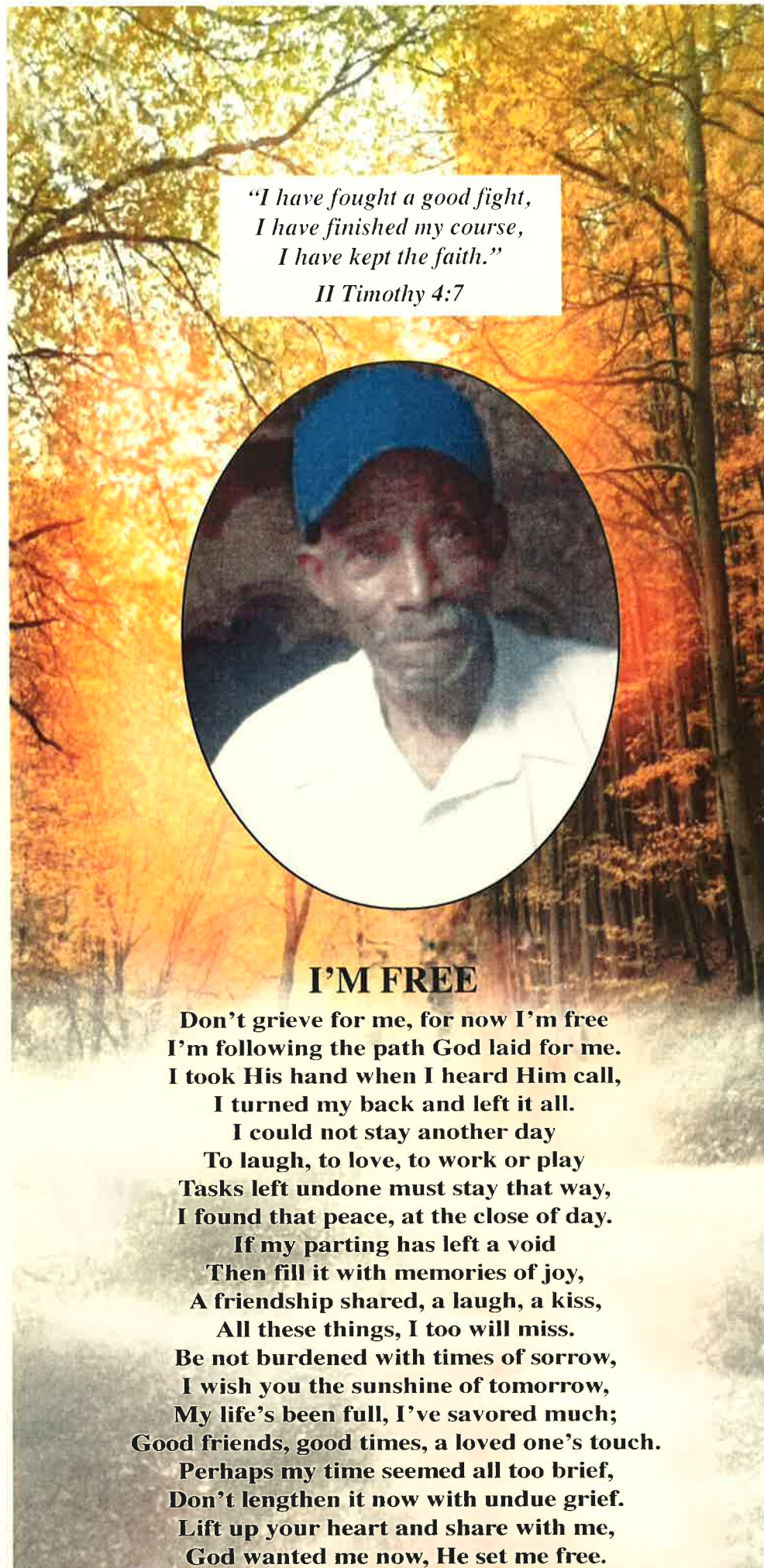
Wallace experienced his early Christian training while attending the First Baptist Church of Fuquay-Varina. He was a humble man and had a gracious heart.
