On October 24, 1998, she married Overseer John Dallas Goodman and became the faithful first lady of Glory Heights Church of God in Christ. Working beside her husband carrying out the work of the ministry. She was the orchestrater of "Youth in Action For Christ", this group increased their faith in Christ as they begin to birth their gifts in ministries. A singing group comprised of her grandchildren and a their friend, called the "Angels of Glory was organized.
