In addition to caring for his mother and his own family, he often found himself standing in the gap for his nieces and nephews. Bryant also had the opportunity and privilege to help care for his brothers Joseph Willie and Errol at the end of their lives. He often referred to the Bible when trying to inspire or help direct those who crossed his path.

Bryant took it upon himself to upkeep the Bruner Family Cemetery in Konawa, OK. He helped to ensure headstones were placed at the resting place of each of his siblings. I'll be the voice that whispers in the breeze. I'm peaceful now, put your mind at ease.


I've rested my eyes and gone to sleep, But memories we've shared are yours to keep.

I've lived a life filled with joy and fun. Live on now, make me proud of what you'll become.


