

# ()bituary

Morris Vernard Hinton, Sr. was the second of four children born to Mr. and Mrs. Morris Hinton in Newport News, VA. He was raised Catholic; however, he joined St. John Missionary Baptist Church where he was baptized in 1976.

He graduated from Public School 5 in Staten Island, NY. After graduating, he joined the United States Air Force in 1964 and was honorably discharged in 1968. He met the love of his life, Annie Mac Marshall, and the two united in marriage in June 1971. To that union, three children were born: Crystal Monique, Danyelle Marchette, and Roderick Vernard.

His job as a truck driver for Leeway Motors brought him to Oklahoma City in 1974. After two years, he began working for Safeway and worked there for 16 years. Morris had a passion for photography ignited by the camera that his wife bought him for a Christmas present. That passion birthed Morris the Cat Photography where he photographed many events around the country. Morris was an avid lover of music. He has an extensive music collection dating back to vinyl albums and eight tracks.

Morris was a dedicated member of the Masonic family, joining in 1979. He was a member of King David Lodge #50 where he faithfully served as Worshipful Master. He was advanced to the 32nd degree in the Great Western Consistory #34 where he also served as Keeper of the Seals and Archives (KSA). He was elevated to the 33rd degree (Grand Inspector General) in 1985 in Washington, DC. He was an Honorary Illustrious Potentate of Alaraf Temple #20, and he also served as the Imperial Photographer for the Imperial Council, Ancient Egyptian Arabic Order Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. He also served as President of the Alaraf Temple #20 Legion of Honor Club. He also served as Past Patron for Lily of the Valley #7 Order of the Eastern Star.

Morris was preceded in death by his parents, Morris Hinton and Vivian Hinton; his daughter, Dawn Ammarie; two sisters, Ollie McAllister and Vivian Dixon; his granddaughter, Jocelyn Heard; and his grandson, Timothy Speight.
