Life Sketch of
Rev. Charles Sinclair Neal II

Sunrise November 1, 1925 – Sunset December 20, 2020

Charles Sinclair Neal II was born in "Neal Bush" in the Township of Virginia, Liberia on Sunday, November 1, 1925 to the blessed union of Charles Sinclair Neal, Sr., and Caroline Taylor-Neal. He accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior at an early age in the Eddie Memorial Methodist Church in Virginia; and remained consistent in his devotion to the body of Christ throughout his lifetime.

While growing up in Neal Bush, young Mybo, as he was affectionately called, and his younger brother Willis had to perform several chores. They had to get fire wood, carry water from the spring, set crawfish baskets, go fishing, cut palm nuts to make oil and make cassava and eddoes farms to help feed and support his family. On Saturday, they took their wares by canoe down the ever flowing St. Paul River to Monrovia to sell them in the marketplace. They bought supplies for the family and the home with the money they earned.

Charles began his educational journey in the 1st and 2nd grades at Bromley Mission in Clay Ashland, Liberia as a day student. He enrolled at the Lott Carey Mission in Brewerville, Liberia in the 3rd grade; where he had to walk about 4 miles, each way, to and from School. In 1948 he graduated from Lott Carey Mission as valedictorian of his class. The following year, he matriculated to The Liberia College. Unfortunately, he had to put his educational journey on hold after his freshman year in college. He took on the responsibility of the family and also became the surrogate father to his nieces and nephews after his parents went to be with the Lord. His first job was a police officer with the Liberian National Police Force. After serving for a year in the police force, he was blessed with a job in the State Department, now the Ministry of Foreign affairs, where he rose quickly through the ranks. He also taught part time at the AGM (Assembly of God Mission) School in Monrovia, Liberia.

On April 7, 1951, he met the love of his life, the beautiful Ethel Fairy Campbell of the House of Campbell and Dyer. After a one year courtship, her family properly vetting him and the customary letter requesting her hand in marriage they said their "I Do's" in the Providence Baptist Church in Monrovia on April 6, 1952. The newlyweds moved to his beloved Neal Bush where he spent the halcyon days of his boyhood and was known as "The Only Rooster That Crowed In Neal Bush." Their union was blessed with eight children three of whom predeceased them. The first child born to their union was John followed by Charles III, and then 1stFairy (deceased), 2ndFairy, Verdelle (deceased), Willis (deceased), Carolyn and Elizabeth Lulu. They also adopted five sons; Moses K. Neal, Jarjay N. Karyeah, James Neal, Albert Atangana (from Cameroon) and Julius J. Neal(JJ). Their union lasted for 68 unbroken years until the "till death do us part" of the vows they took became a reality when he was called from labor to reward on December 28, 2020 in their home in Oklahoma City.

In 1956 he re-enrolled in The University of Liberia (formerly Liberia College) and graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Secondary Education in 1959. He was ordained as a Minister of the Gospel with The St. Paul River District Conference as well as the Liberia Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church in 1960. He served as Pastor of the following churches in Liberia: Concurrently at St. Luke UMC in White Plains and St. James UMC in Robertsville, Eddie Memorial UMC in Virginia, Burns Phelps UMC in Brewerville City, Reeves Memorial UMC in Crozerville, First UMC in Kakata City and The UMC in Yekepa, Nimba County. He served as Assistant District Superintendent and District Superintendent respectively in the St. Paul River District of the UMC in Liberia. He also served at Quayle UMC in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and The First United Methodist Church of Crescent, Oklahoma.

In 1961, Rev. Neal was blessed with an appointment to the Foreign Service by the Late President William V. S. Tubman as 1st Secretary and Consul to the Embassy of Liberia near Yaoundé, Cameroon. This was a good fit for him because he was a natural in the vineyard of diplomacy. He faithfully served his country as a consummate diplomat from 1961 thru 1968. From 1969 to 1970, he taught English at the Methodist Elementary School (now J.J. Roberts) and The College of West Africa. He also taught French in the MCSS (Monrovia Consolidated School System).

He joined the Ministry of Planning and Economic Affairs as Administrative Coordinator in 1970 and worked in several capacities for 30 years; He had to leave that position in 1990 because of the internece civil war. In 1991 he joined his wife and children in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma where he resided until his passing. He was a member of several fraternities including the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons, The I.O.G.T. (International Order of Good Templars) and The UBF (United Brothers of Friendship). He was also a captain in the 6th Infantry Regiment of the Republic of Liberia.

He was predeceased by his parents Charles Sinclair Neal, Sr., and Caroline Taylor-Neal, his children. The 1stFairy Neal, Willis Neal, Verdelle Neal-Cooper, and Moses K. Neal, his grand children Dimanche Neal, Charles Sinclair Neal IV aka Spyda and Jewel Knuckles-Ashiq and his four siblings, John R. Neal, Isabella Neal-Smallwood, Louise Neal-Ricks and Willis N. Neal, his nieces Virginia Mary Neal, Anna Gray-Kamara and Caroline Roberts-Conteh.

He leaves to cherish his memory, his loving and caring wife of sixty eight unbroken years Ethel Fairy Neal, his children John Hygliptus Neal, Sr., Charles Sinclair Neal, III, (Darlene), Fairy Neal-Knuckles, Carolyn Neal, Elizabeth "Lulu" Neal-Maycole (Melvin), Isabella M. Neal, Julius J. Neal, James Neal (Arnett), Albert Atangana, Jarjay N Karyeah (Mary), his nieces Gwendolyn Roberts, Louise Washington, Isabella Johnson (David), Velmont Richardson, Viola Smallwood-Robinson, Benetta Smallwood-Conneh (Jimmy), Zoe Kamara-Wilson (Ike) and Ethel Kamara, several grand, great grand and great great grandchildren, and a host of relatives.

Our beloved Papie was a great man of God who always gave of his best to the master. He was a kind, loving, warm hearted member of the human race who spoke the universal language of humanity. He loved his darling wife his children and his family unconditionally. He also touched many lives from all walks of life while traveling on life's highway.

Neal, The Only Rooster, Mr. Neal, Teacher Neal, Papie, Uncle Papie Mybo, Uncle Mybo, Uncle Charles, Borbor Charles, Bor Charles, Cousin Charles, Con Charley or Sarlaynee; You were a tireless soldier in God's Army. You fought the good fight, you finished the race, you kept the faith and now you are following the path he laid for you. Well done faithful servant! Now your laborer's task is over, go and take your well deserved rest until we meet again...
